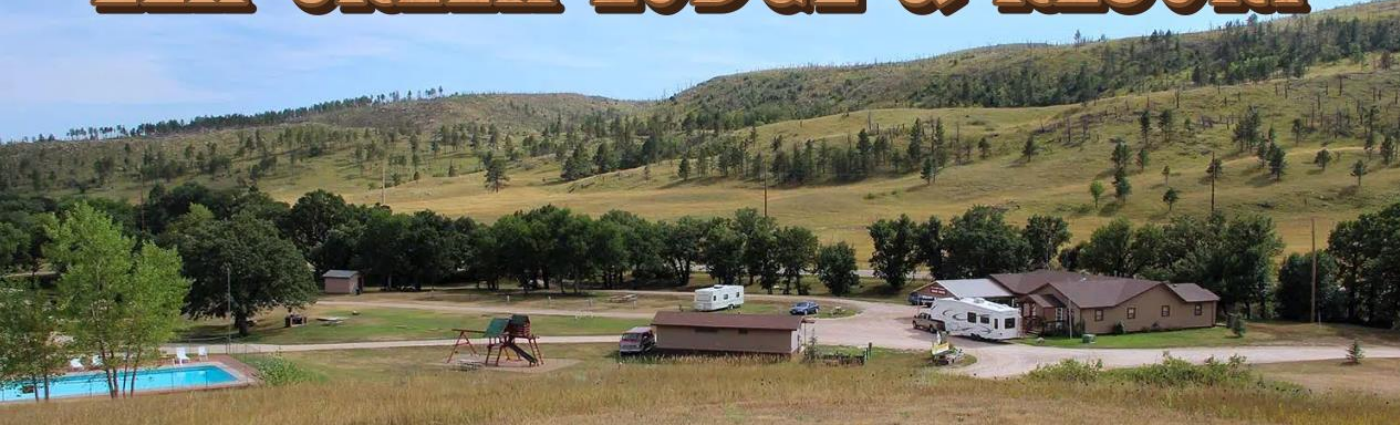

Rhode Island reaches settlement with voting machine vendor over primary election errors

Secretary Gorbea Announces Settlement with Election Systems and Software Over Errors in the 2022 Election

The Rhode Island Department of State has reached a settlement with voting machine vendor Election Systems and Software (ES&S) following programming errors that were discovered during the 2022 primary election.

As part of the settlement, ES&S will provide a credit of \$47,644 for all project management services provided during the election. In addition, the company has agreed to post a public statement (included below) on its website outlining best practices for collaborative Logic & Accuracy testing.

After the discovery of the programming errors in August, the Rhode Island Department of State's Elections Division worked with ES&S and the Rhode Island Board of Elections to develop new collaborative testing protocols to verify the accuracy of voting screens in both English and Spanish, as well as the accuracy of printed ballot cards.

Secretary of State Nellie Gorbea stated, "We have held our vendor accountable for their mistake, and working together we have succeeded in making systemic improvements to pre-election testing across my office, the Board of Elections and ES&S."

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As part of the settlement, ES&S will provide a credit of \$47,644 for all project management services provided during the election. In addition, the company has agreed to post a public statement (included below) on its website outlining best practices for collaborative Logic & Accuracy testing.

Pre-election testing includes logic and accuracy (L&A) testing. It's the process by which the machines and ballots are publicly tested by jurisdictions before Election Day to confirm that the ballot content is accurate and those ballots will tabulate a voter's selections correctly. L&A testing increases confidence in elections.

ES&S wants to reiterate its recommendation for best practices which are contained on our online customer portal. "L&A testing starts with proofing all of your ballot styles, both paper and touch screen, for accuracy in layout and contests." This will ensure that all touch screens match exactly paper ballots, in every language used for voting.

Furthermore, we have also expressed: "To test your tabulation equipment, use a test deck of ballots and or ExpressVote vote summary cards containing votes for each candidate and questions in all contests, and where the expected results are known." This means that on touch screens, testing should include votes for all candidates and questions in all races. As we have said: "You can create your own test deck independently by manually filling out ballots for all ballot styles in sufficient quantity to vote all candidates/questions in all contests."

Voting machine company settles with RI over Spanish language ballot blunder

The election equipment provider in the middle of a blunder on Spanish language ballots in the September primaries has agreed to credit Rhode Island \$47,644, Secretary of State Nellie Gorbea said Thursday.

Nebraska-based Election Systems and Software "will provide a credit for all project management services provided in connection with the 2022 Primary Election," Gorbea said in a news release.

The company also agreed to post a message on its website reminding election workers that it's a good idea to proofread all ballots and test all tabulation machines before voters head to the polls.

"We have held our vendor accountable for their mistake, and working together we have succeeded in making systemic improvements to pre-election testing across my office, the Board of Elections and ES&S," Gorbea said in the release.

Voting rights groups call for investigation of Election Day problems in Northampton County

“The county’s conflicting messages to the public on Election Day led to confusion, concern, and doubt in the security and accuracy of votes. These mistakes grow into misinformation,” said Philip Hensley-Robin, executive director of Common Cause PA.

The [voting machine malfunction](#) forced voters in Northampton County to vote via emergency ballots. County election officials said the issue was a “clerical error.”

The malfunction occurred in the Superior Court retention race where the voter had to select ‘Yes’ or ‘No’ to vote for Judges Jack Panella and Victor Stabile to retain their seats.

“The programming error that occurred in Northampton County should be a lesson for every Pennsylvania county that uses hybrid touch screen voting machines,” Marian Schneider, senior policy counsel for voting rights at the ACLU of Pennsylvania, said.

In addition to the investigation and report, the groups called on the county to evaluate voting machine logic and accuracy testing procedures and make adjustments to catch errors; issue public notices to allow observers during the testing, as required by the Election Code; and supply polling places with adequate emergency paper ballots, equal to 50% of the poll’s registered voters.

Counties are required to perform logic and accuracy testing of all voting machines. According to the [Pennsylvania Department of State](#), the testing is designed to detect issues with screen calibration, mislabeling and other potential problems to ensure the machines work properly.

“While the county completed some of this testing, it was not completed to adequacy or full compliance; otherwise the issue would have been caught and corrected before Election Day,” the voting rights groups said in a statement.

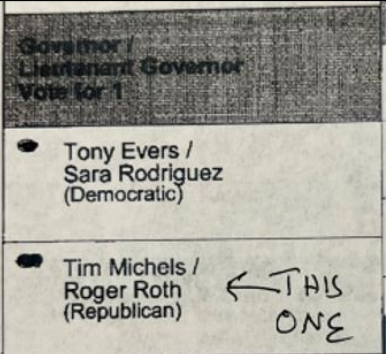
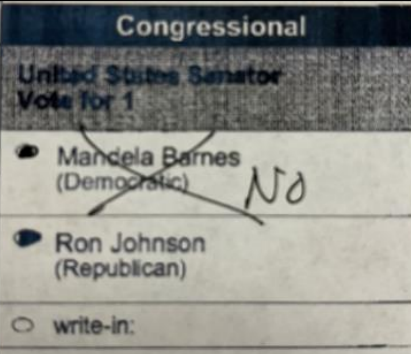
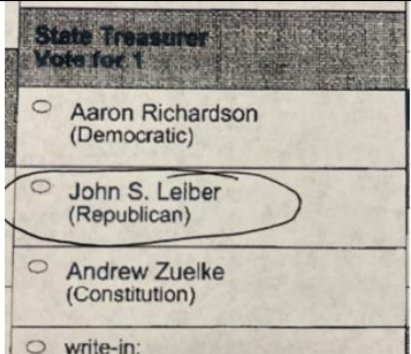
(iii) Before testing an electronic voting system for an election, notify the county chairman of each political party having a candidate on the ballot, stating the time and place of the test. The political party representatives and representatives of independent candidates may be present for the test, which shall be held at least two (2) weeks before the election. The test shall ascertain that the automatic tabulating equipment will accurately count the votes cast for all offices and all measures. **The test shall be conducted by processing a preaudited group of paper ballots or ballot cards on which are recorded a predetermined number of valid votes for each candidate and on each measure and shall include for each office one (1) or more ballots which have votes in excess of the number allowed by law in order to test the ability of the automatic tabulating equipment to reject such votes.** During the test a different number of valid votes shall be assigned to each candidate for an office, and for and against each measure. If any error is detected, the cause of it shall be ascertained and corrected and an errorless count shall be secured and certified to by the county clerk. On completion of the count, the programs, test materials and ballots shall be sealed and retained as provided for paper ballots;

- Death Records – Review Monthly
- National Change of Address (NCOA) Review Monthly.
 - 3 Year look back
- Clerk of Courts – Should send a list to County Auditor each month:
 - County Auditor to remove individuals any individual called for jury duty who is excused from jury duty because the individual:
 - Has Moved
 - Has Been Identified as mentally incompetent
 - Has Been Sentenced to imprisonment in the federal penitentiary system
 - Deceased voters published in an obituary, reported by a county coroner, or recorded in the death records maintained as vital statistics records by the Department of Health
 - Those who are not citizens of the United States
- No Charge for Voter Rolls, It's Our Data, We Already Paid for the Systems

Election Officials – Use of Machines

- Audit Your Equipment & Accessories.
 - If it is not on the certified list, you can't use it.
 - Desktops, Laptops, Servers, thumb drives.
 - Ask for Engineering Change Orders from your vendor, where needed.
- Check Antivirus
 - If it is not update to date, ask your vendor for an Engineering Change Order.
- Follow the State Laws and Rules for use of equipment.
- Reusing Thumb Drives
 - The vendor should reformat them for you, don't risk it doing it yourself.
 - Only thumb drives on the Certified List are allowed to be inserted into election equipment.

- Let Voters Fill Out Ballots and Test Separately
- Publish Test Deck Reports on County Web Site
- Public Test Deck Cast Vote Records on County Web Site

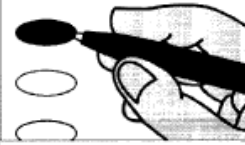

(d) A vendor shall file in the office of the secretary of state an application for certification of an electronic voting system and the secretary of state shall approve the application before any electronic voting system to be used in an election conducted under this code may be distributed, sold or upgraded by the vendor. The application for certification of an electronic voting system shall contain the following documentation:
 - (i) Proof that the electronic voting system has been certified by the United States election assistance commission;
- - (ii) Proof that the electronic voting system meets the voluntary voting system guidelines adopted by the United States election assistance commission;

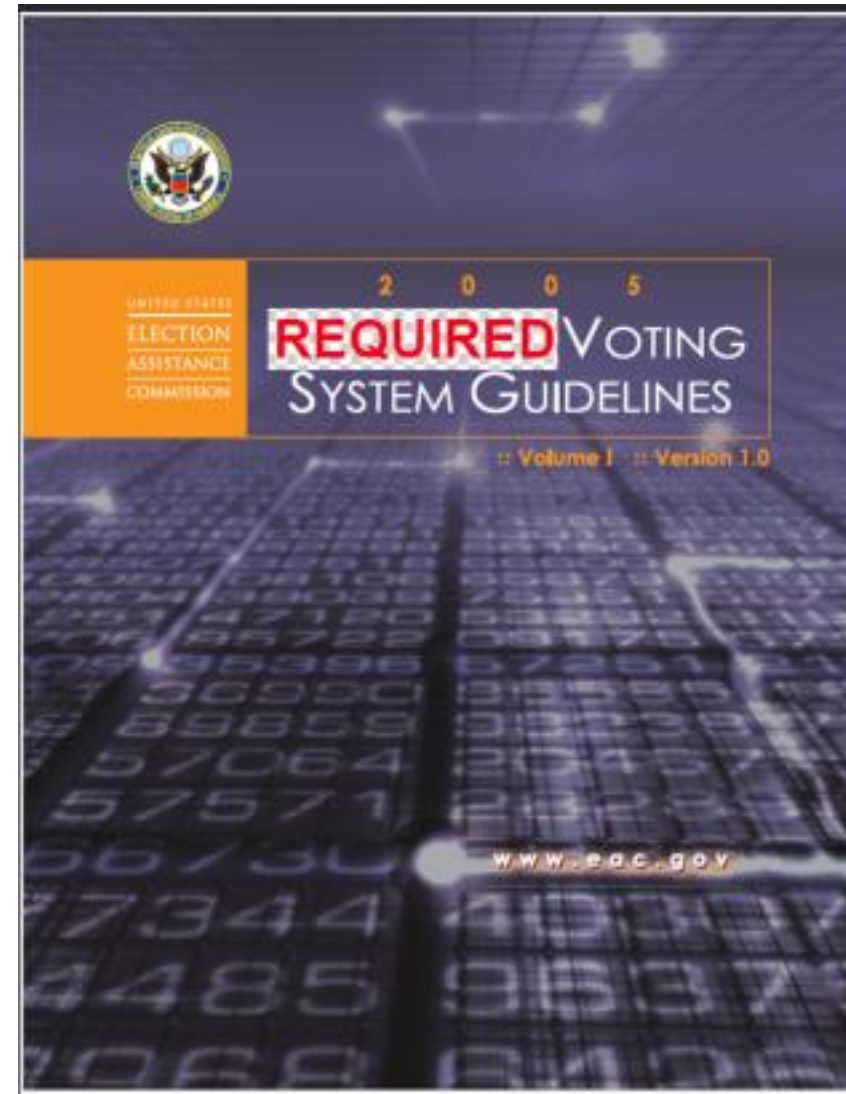
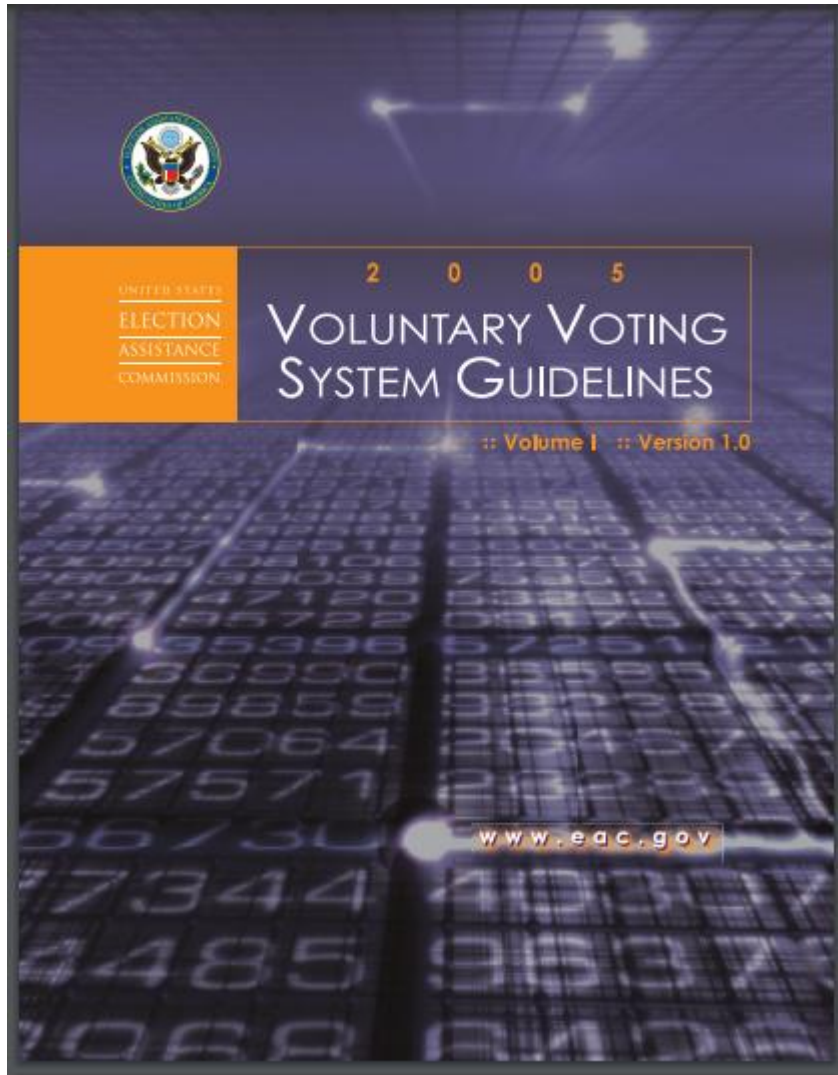

- (a) A county clerk notifies the secretary of state of a significant problem with the equipment or the secretary of state determines there is a significant problem with the equipment;
- (b) The secretary of state determines that the equipment fails to meet the requirements necessary for approval or continued compliance;**
- (c) The secretary of state determines there is a need for significant enhancements or adjustments to the equipment;
- (d) The vendor fails to notify the secretary of state of significant enhancements or adjustments which are necessary to the equipment;**
- (e) Upon written request by the secretary of state, the vendor fails to submit the equipment for re-examination by an EAC/NIST certified VSTL;**
- (f) The equipment does not produce accurate results and reports as required by law;
- (g) Changes are made in the equipment that do not comply with the requirements for certification;**
- (h) The equipment is no longer used by any county in Wyoming or is no longer available for purchase or repair from the company; or
- (i) The equipment, vendor or its employees are found to be problematic in ensuring elections as critical infrastructure.**

SOS Election Procedures Chapter 12 - Section 4. Procedure for Notice of Possible Withdrawal of Certification and Remedy Process. At any time after the certification of equipment, the secretary of state may withdraw such certification by complying with the following procedures:

- (a) Written notice of the grounds for possible withdrawal is given to the vendor. Such notice shall include the following information:
 - (i) The reason(s) for possible withdrawal of certification; and
 - (ii) The date upon which certification may be withdrawn.
- (b) If the vendor is notified of grounds for a withdrawal of certification, the vendor is responsible for all fees associated with any remedy necessary to maintain certification.
- (c) The vendor shall have thirty (30) days to respond to the notice of grounds for withdrawal of certification. The vendor's response shall contain one or more of the following:
 - (i) A description of the corrective measures taken;
 - (ii) An explanation as to why the problem is not significant and the reason corrective measures do not need to be taken; or
 - (iii) An explanation as to why there is no problem with the equipment.
- (d) After receiving the vendor's response, the secretary of state shall within forty-five (45) days determine whether:
 - (i) The vendor's corrective measures are satisfactory;
 - (ii) The explanations offered are satisfactory;
 - (iii) Further explanation is necessary; or
 - (iv) Withdrawal of certification is required.
- (e) The secretary of state shall notify the vendor and counties of the decision in writing within ten (10) business days after making the determination.

- (c) The use of the equipment could jeopardize the integrity of an election;**
- (d) The equipment, vendor or its employees are found to be problematic in ensuring elections as critical infrastructure; or**
- (e) The secretary of state determines that a single vendor is to be used for the purposes of equipment uniformity.

(a)Reporting of Upgrades and Modifications in Equipment and Software: The vendor shall notify the secretary of state of all planned upgrades, patches, and modifications to the equipment to include a description of the upgrades, patches and/or modifications and the areas impacted. The notification form shall be designed and provided by the secretary of state. No upgrades, patches, or modifications shall be applied without written approval by the secretary of state.

(b)Odd Year Reporting: By July 1 of each odd numbered year, the vendor shall certify to the secretary of state a list, by county, of the equipment being used and other related demographics as required within the reporting form that shall be designed and provided by the secretary of state.

(c)Election Year Reporting: By May 1 of each general election year, the vendor shall certify to the secretary of state a list providing information about the software and firmware versions being used by county. The reporting form shall be designed and provided by the secretary of state.

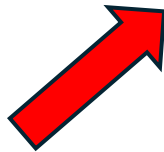

The commission admonished Election Systems & Software over promotional literature and statements on its website that appear to assert, falsely, that voting machines the company sells with embedded modems have been sanctioned by the EAC under its testing and certification program. The statements put ES&S in violation of the EAC's testing and certification rules, the commission wrote in a previously unreported [March 20 letter to the company that POLITICO obtained](#), and directed ES&S to revise the literature and notify customers that the systems are not certified.

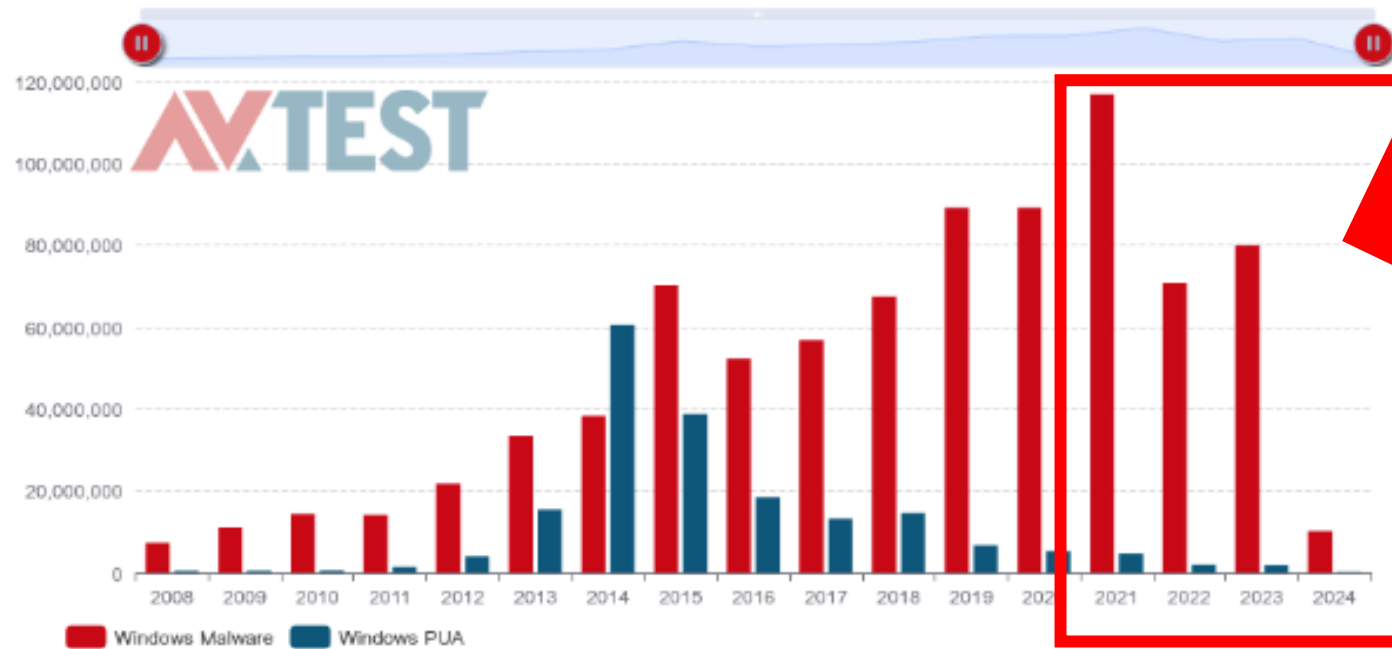

Good morning

In response to your questions submitted yesterday:

1. If the laptop is being used as part of an EAC certified voting system, then yes, the county should look to have the vendor submit an engineering change order. Adding new models of laptop to an already certified system with an ECO is very common, and is one of the most frequently used reasons for ECO submissions.
2. The ECO process can be used to update antivirus definition files and other security updates to voting systems. This was the subject of a Notification of Clarification (NOC) issued in 2019, which can be found on our website: <https://www.eac.gov/noc-19-01>

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EAC 2019 Statement

Purpose:

The de minimis change process is used by the EAC to allow minor modifications to a certified voting system. In the past, this has been applied primarily to hardware changes as software changes often require a new version and build. Additionally, past practice has been that if a de minimis change required VSTL testing, it was classified as a system modification.

Clarification:

The EAC has determined that allowing software de minimis changes is necessary to confront a rapidly evolving cybersecurity threat environment as well as allowing Manufacturers to quickly respond to changing jurisdictional requirements, where those requirements can be addressed with minor changes.

Software de minimis changes should have the following general characteristics:

1. Update a discrete component of the system and do not impact overall system functionality;
2. Do not modify the counting or tally logic of a component or the system (formatting changes to reports are allowable);
3. Do not affect the accuracy of the component or system;
4. Do not negatively impact the functionality, performance, accessibility, usability, safety, or security of a component or system;
5. Do not alter the overall configuration of the certified system (e.g. adding ballot marking device functionality to a previously certified DRE component);
6. Can be reviewed and/or tested by VSTL personnel in a short amount of time (approximately less than 100 hours).

Conclusion:

As of the date of this Clarification, the EAC will consider software de minimis changes submitted in accordance with the Testing and Certification Program Manual, Version 2.0 with the following clarifications:

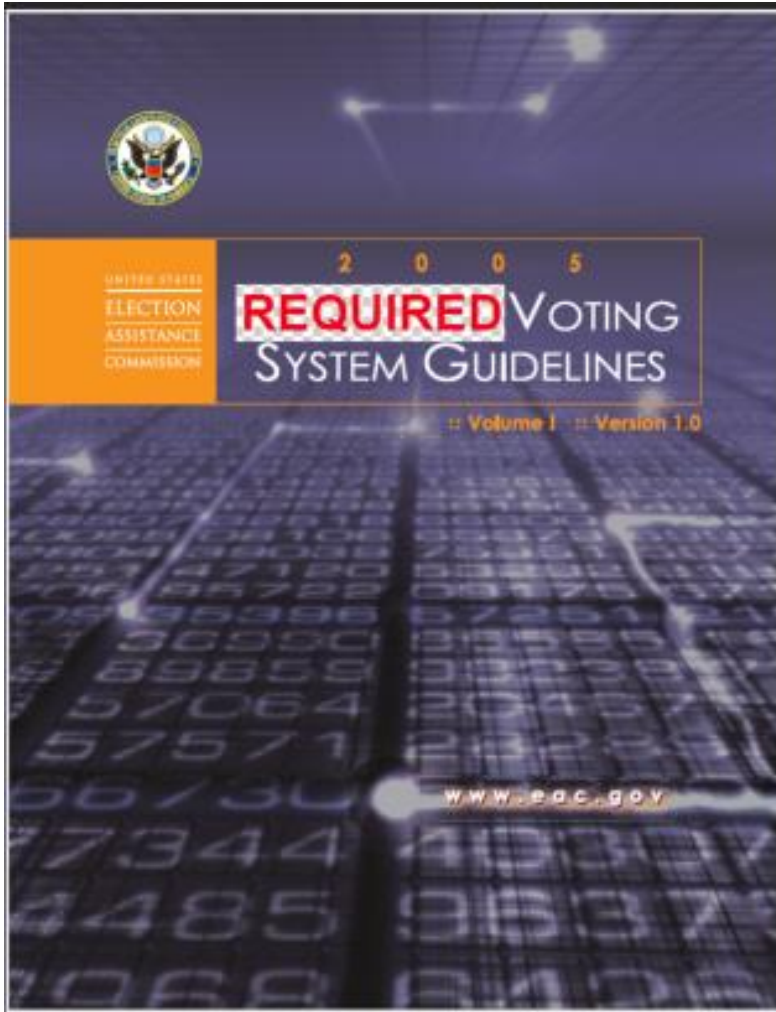

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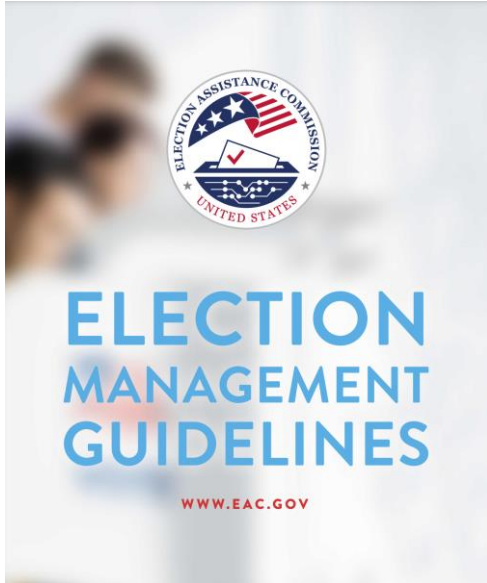
End-to-End Voting System Acceptance Test

It tests the election management system itself and tests the ability of the EMS to interface with all the types of components. It also verifies that the EMS correctly tabulates votes and prints reports. Election officials should conduct this test on all newly acquired voting systems and after any event that could have altered the voting system, such as a system upgrade or if the EMS hardware leaves the custody and control of the election authority.

Materials Required: Election officials must know the correct versions of the operating systems and EMS software. In addition, the testers will need the following:

- A complete election management system with all required election management system software installed.

- If Optical Scanners are used:
 - At least one ballot scanner. If different types are used (e.g., precinct-based for polling locations and bulk/high-speed for central counting), then at least one of each type will be needed.
 - One blank memory device used to load the election definition onto the ballot scanner(s),
 - A memory device for each scanner to store tabulated results and Cast Vote Records.
 - At least one set of pre-marked optical scan test ballots with known results. This can be the same test deck used to conduct acceptance tests on the ballot scanners.



Documentation: If any component of the voting system experiences a failure during any of the above steps that the tester cannot correct, the test should be terminated. The tester should prepare documentation that lists the serial number of the election computer and the serial number or other identifying information for any other component that failed, the persons conducting the tests, the date, and a description of the failure.

Election officials should make two copies of this documentation; one copy for the permanent record and another copy that stays with the failed component of the voting system to assist those making any required repairs. All printouts should be attached to the copy retained for the permanent record.

If the voting system passes all the above tests, election officials should prepare documentation for the permanent record, including the names of those conducting the tests and the date. All printouts should be attached to this documentation.

Post Election Audit is 2 steps

22-11-109. Post election audit.

The county clerk shall conduct a random audit of ballots by processing the preaudited group of test ballots as described in W.S. 22-11-104(b)(iii) on five percent (5%) of the automated tabulating equipment for that county, but on not less than one (1) machine, within thirty (30) days of any election in which the tabulating equipment was used.

Should be auditing the actual voted ballots with a hand count.

Redoing the test deck is invalid, and does not review the real-world ballots that were cast...

(iii) Before testing an electronic voting system for an election, notify the county chairman of each political party having a candidate on the ballot, stating the time and place of the test. The political party representatives and representatives of independent candidates may be present for the test, which shall be held at least two (2) weeks before the election. The test shall ascertain that the automatic tabulating equipment will accurately count the votes cast for all offices and all measures. The test shall be conducted by processing a preaudited group of paper ballots or ballot cards on which are recorded a predetermined number of valid votes for each candidate and on each measure and shall include for each office one (1) or more ballots which have votes in excess of the number allowed by law in order to test the ability of the automatic tabulating equipment to reject such votes. During the test a different number of valid votes shall be assigned to each candidate for an office, and for and against each measure. If any error is detected, the cause of it shall be ascertained and corrected and an errorless count shall be secured and certified to by the county clerk. On completion of the count, the programs, test materials and ballots shall be sealed and retained as provided for paper ballots;

(iv) Designate one (1) or more counting centers;

(v) Provide adequate security for the delivery of all ballots to the designated counting center;

(vi) Provide that if any ballot is damaged or defective so that it cannot be properly counted by the automatic tabulating equipment, a true, duplicate copy shall be made by counting board members and substituted for the damaged or defective ballot. All duplicate ballots shall be clearly labeled "Duplicate" and shall bear a serial number which shall be recorded on the damaged or defective ballot. Damaged or defective ballots shall be delivered with the returns to the county clerk.

(vii) Ensure that every electronic voting system used in the county has and uses an air gap.

(c) In addition to any other duties prescribed by law, election judges in polling places using an electronic voting system shall:

(i) Repealed By Laws 2014, Ch. 108, § 2.

(ii) Provide adequate instruction in the use of the voting device to each voter before he enters the voting booth. Additional instruction may be provided as specified by law.

WY - Post Election Audit

22-6-130. Post-election ballot audit.

(a) Each county clerk shall complete an audit of the county's unofficial election results by identifying and reviewing the smallest observable percentage between the statewide candidates who received the most votes and the statewide candidates who received the second highest votes for each contest within the county not later than the first Thursday following a primary, special or general election. Additional contests may be added to the audit at the discretion of the county clerk. Using a formula developed by the University of Wyoming, each county clerk shall use the smallest observable percentage to determine a statistically significant sample size of the ballots to be audited under this section. To ensure the timely completion of this procedure under this subsection, the number of ballots audited shall not exceed five percent (5%) of the total number of ballots cast.

(b) Each county clerk shall conduct an audit of the election using the statistically significant ballot sample size and the corresponding ballots for the contests selected for audit determined under subsection (a) of this section. Each county clerk shall provide the audit results to the secretary of state not later than one (1) day before the meeting of the state canvassing board as provided in W.S. 22-16-118.

County Authorization (Local Control)

22-11-102. Use authorized; purchase or lease.

The board of county commissioners of each county may adopt for use, either experimentally or permanently, in any election in any or all polling places within the county, any electronic voting system authorized by law.
