D-Suite 5.5-C is a paper-based optical scan voting system. D-Suite 5.5-C consist of the following major components:

The Appendix of the Minnesota Secretary of State (MNSOS) Certification Report and Recommendation of Dominion Democracy Suite, version 5.5-C Voting System (DDS 5.5-C), dated April 12, 2022, includes a chart indicating DDS 5.5-C version is the fourth modification of the original system DDS 5.0. This chart contradicts the statements made in its introduction.⁷

7. The US Election Assistance Commission (EAC) is an "independent, bipartisan commission charged with developing guidance to meet HAVA requirements, adopting voluntary voting system guidelines, and serving as a national clearinghouse of information on election administration." The EAC also certifies voting system and is responsible for accrediting the independent testing laboratories that certify voting systems. The law also established the Technical Guidelines Development Committee to assist the EAC in the development of voluntary voting system guidelines. The EAC sets the standards for election administration in the United States and makes the determination of whether a voting system is new or modified.⁸

2.0 PRE-CERTIFICATION TESTING AND ISSUES

2.1 Evaluation of Prior VSTL Testing

The D-Suite 5.0 is a new voting system that has not previously been tested to applicable federal standards in the EAC Program. The Dominion Voting Systems D-Suite 4.14-E system, previously certified by the EAC (Reference NTS Report No. PR036164-01 Rev. C, which is available for viewing on the EAC's website at <u>www.eac.gov</u>) contains various components of the system currently under test. For this reason, the TDP review that was previously performed will be utilized to meet the requirements of part of the required TDP review; only the updated portions of the TDP will be reviewed as part of this test program.

2.2 Evaluation of Prior Non-VSTL Testing

The D-Suite 5.0 is a new voting system that has not previously been tested to applicable federal standards in the EAC Program.





The MNSOS Certification of Dominion Democracy Suite Version 5.5-C Voting System, dated May 2, 2022, corrects the error in the introduction of its own report by its removal of the language determining DDS 5.5-C is a modification from the 4.14-E system and also confirms the position of both the EAC and Pro V & V that the DDS 5.0 system was a new system, as supported by the information in the Appendix of that same report:

"The D-Suite 5.5-C Voting System configuration is a modification from the EAC approved D-Suite 5.5-B Voting System. The D-Suite 5.5-B system configuration is a modification of the D-Suite 5.5 System configuration. The D-Suite 5.5 System configuration is a modification to the D-Suite 5.0 System configuration."¹²

13. Through data practices requests, it has been confirmed that Dakota County was using Dominion Democracy Suite 4.14-E in both 2020 and 2021.



- 14.Based on a thorough review of the aforementioned documents and subsequent analysis, in my expert opinion:
 - a. Dominion Democracy Suite, version 4.14 was a modification of Dominion Democracy Suite 4.0, which was the original version of the 4.0 voting system. That system was first certified for use in Minnesota by the secretary of state in January 7, 2014 and has remained in use in Dakota County and some of its municipalities until the current election cycle.
 - b. Dominion Democracy Suite version 5.5C is a modification of Dominion Democracy Suite, version 5.0, which was a new voting system distinct from the original Democracy Suite version 4.0 and all revisions of version 4.0.
 - c. Any county or municipality opting to utilize any version of the Dominion Democracy Suite 5.0 for the first time in this election cycle will be utilizing a new election voting system in this election cycle, including recently certified Dominion Democracy Suite version 5.5C and 5.5CS.

BACKGROUND

Staff is recommending designating the Dakota County Tribune as its official newspaper in 2022.

Staff received quotes from Dakota County Tribune, and St. Paul Pioneer Press, as follows:

Dakota County Tribune

- Currently designated Official Newspaper; no change in rate from 2021.
- · Cost for legal ads in 2021 is \$7.20 per column inch, plus \$20 charge for any typing.
- · All publication notices are due by 10:00 am on Tuesday for publication in the same week.

St. Paul Pioneer Press

- Cost for legal ads in 2021 is \$6.58 per column inch.
- Publication notices are due by 12:00 pm on the day prior to publication.

Per state statute 331A.04; If there are one or more qualified newspapers, the first priority for designating an official newspaper is that of a newspaper located within the political subdivision, staff recommends that a motion be made to designate the Dakota County Tribune.

RECOMMENDATION

All statutory cities are required to designate an official newspaper each year. All required legal documents and notices for the City of Rosemount will be published in the official newspaper. Staff recommends that a motion be made to designate the Dakota County Tribune as the City's official newspaper for 2022.

Thank you for responding so quickly. No, I am not asking about e-poll pads or e-poll books. Dakota County was using Dominion Voting System software version 4.14E until May of this year. This voting system included Microsoft operating system and server software that was beyond end-of-life and no longer supported. The software had not received any security patches or updates since January of 2020, yet was used in all of the 2020 and 2021 elections and some 2022 township elections. Perhaps in an effort to amend this lack of security and support, at the end of May the county with the assistance of the Office of the Secretary of State upgraded to a new Dominion Voting System version 5.5C. 5.5C is a newer, though not the newest, modification of Dominion's new Voting System 5.0. According to the Elections Assistance Commission (EAC) 5.0 was a completely new voting system software unrelated to version 4.14E. Therefore the change is an upgrade to something new rather than just an update of something in use, and it even included the need for newer, faster hardware in the form of a new server. The Office of the Secretary of State is certifying that because 5.5C is a modification of 5.0, this change is just a modification. However, the county did not update from 5.0 to 5.5C, instead they upgraded from 4.14E directly to 5.5C.
