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Klobuchar Statement on Russian Interference in 2016 Election

December 12, 2016

WASHINGTON, DC – U.S. Senator Amy Klobuchar today released the following statement regarding the proposed bipartisan Congressional investigation into Russia's interference with the 2016 election. She had earlier called for an investigation into Russian involvement in the 2016 election. She was also one of 27 Democratic and Republican Senators who sent a letter to President-Elect Trump calling for him to stand with the people of Ukraine against Russian aggression.

"Foreign interference in our elections is a threat to our democracy and our security and cannot be tolerated. Russia's role in the 2016 election warrants a full and thorough Congressional investigation, and I'm encouraged that Republican leaders, including Majority Leader McConnell and Senators McCain and Graham, have joined with Democratic leaders in calling for bipartisan investigations. I look forward to a comprehensive investigation – free from partisanship and politics – in order to uncover all the facts and make sure our future elections are safeguarded from overseas interference."

Klobuchar will be the ranking member of the Senate Rules Committee during the 115th Congress. Among other issues, the committee handles matters related to federal elections. She is also a member of the Senate Judiciary Committee.

Scott Green's 40-year career was likewise rooted in public service, but it was his work on the football field as an NFL official (eventually spanning 20 years and three Super Bowls) that led him off Capitol Hill to create Lafayette Group. Mr. Green's public safety career began as a probation officer during which time he received a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice Administration from Arizona State University. He went on to serve in the San Diego, California, court system, before coming to Washington, D.C., to serve over a decade as a staff assistant to the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee for then-Senator Joseph Biden. His primary duties with the Senate Judiciary Committee involved issues and legislation impacting public safety services.

During his tenure, Mr. Green was instrumental in writing legislation that focused attention and resources on improvements in public safety technology and communications.

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Election Security

Overview

On January 6, 2017, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) designated elections as critical infrastructure. Although individual state and local jurisdictions conduct elections, protecting election infrastructure is a national responsibility shared between federal, state, and local governments and their private sector partners. In addition to being a whole-of-government and cross-sector responsibility, election security involves multiple aspects of homeland security. These include cybersecurity, physical security, supply chain security, and emergency communications—all areas in which LGI possesses significant expertise.

The dynamic combination of subject-matter experts, management consultants, design specialists, and researchers has enabled LGI to become an integral partner in assisting federal clients with their election security efforts. LGI's contribution to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency's (CISA) election security mission began with stakeholder engagement and outreach, specifically to state and local election authorities. 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Klobuchar Leads Landmark Election Security Bill

Over three dozen senators have cosponsored the legislation

WASHINGTON – U.S. Senator Amy Klobuchar (MN), Ranking Member of the Senate Rules Committee with jurisdiction over federal elections, introduced major election security legislation with 38 Senate cosponsors. The *Election Security Act* would require backup paper ballots and provide election security grants to states for cyber improvements and audits. The *Election Security Act* represents the election security portions of H.R.1 and was introduced as standalone legislation in the House of Representatives last week.

“We have overwhelming evidence that foreign adversaries are interfering in our elections, but we continue to do nothing to protect the integrity of our democracy. Election security is national security, and it is past time for congress to take action,” Klobuchar said. **“We must do everything in our power to protect our election systems from future attacks and this legislation will ensure those on the front-lines of administering elections are equipped with the tools and resources necessary to safeguard elections.”**

Election Integrity Goals

- 1) Require State or Federal Govt. issued ID for voting; Free State Issued ID for voting.
- 2) End vouching;
- 3) 14 days of Absentee voting time, except military;
- 4) No Drop Boxes;
- 5) Remove Mail in Ballots, In-Person only, except military;
- 6) Removal of Poll Books, Paper Registrations Only;

Election Integrity Goals

- 7) Only relatives or court appointed guardians can help a person vote: staff member of facilities not allowed to help vote;
- 8) Restore Party Balance at Ballot Boards: Change MN Stat to require representation proportional to vote in last statewide election; don't allow city or county employees to be used.
- 9) No County or State Canvass completed until all voter histories are updated. Any discrepancies MUST be included in canvass report.
- 10) Election Contests challenge deadline extended to 21 days after all voter histories are completed.

Be a County Liaison

Voter Protection County Liaisons are among the most important members of the Voter Protection team. The time commitment for a Liaison is about 4-5 hours per month, which may increase in the fall. The DFL Voter Protection Director, together with the DFL Coordinated Campaign team, will provide consistent training and assistance for the County Liaisons, ensuring that they will be supported in everything they do.

Before Election Day: The Liaison focuses on building a good relationship with local election officials to enhance the Liaison's impact on Election Day and during the absentee voting period. Further, the Liaison provides early warning on potential issues, advocates for the Voter Protection Team's goals, and obtains information essential to an effective Election Day.

On Election Day and during the absentee voting period: Most issues that arise on Election Day and during the absentee voting period will be resolved informally through reason, persuasion, and appeals to fairness – including appeals by the County Liaison.

After Election Day: Under state law, county canvass boards meet at the county auditor's office between the third and tenth days following the general election to "promptly and publicly" canvass the general election returns. The post-election period is particularly important when an election is close and will be essential to a successful recount if a recount is necessary. Having established strong relationships with local election officials, the Liaison is the ideal person to attend the post-election canvass.

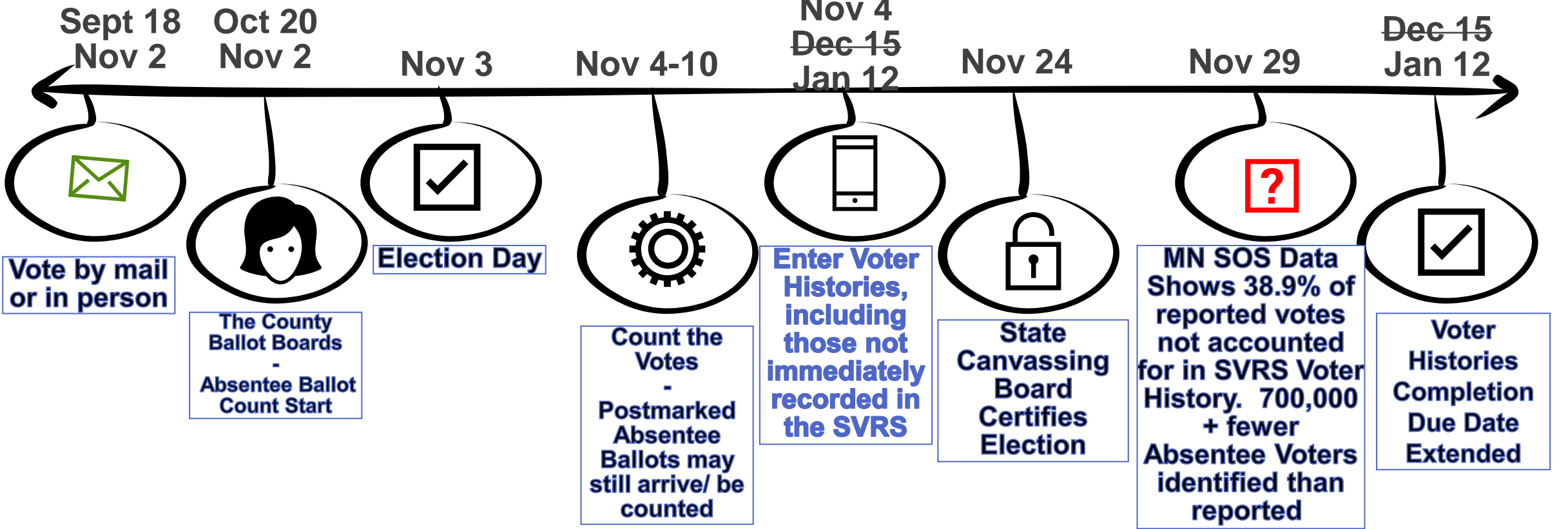

Coleman/Franken recount and expansion of the Ballot Boards

On 11/04/08 there were approximately 12,000 properly rejected Absentee Ballots.

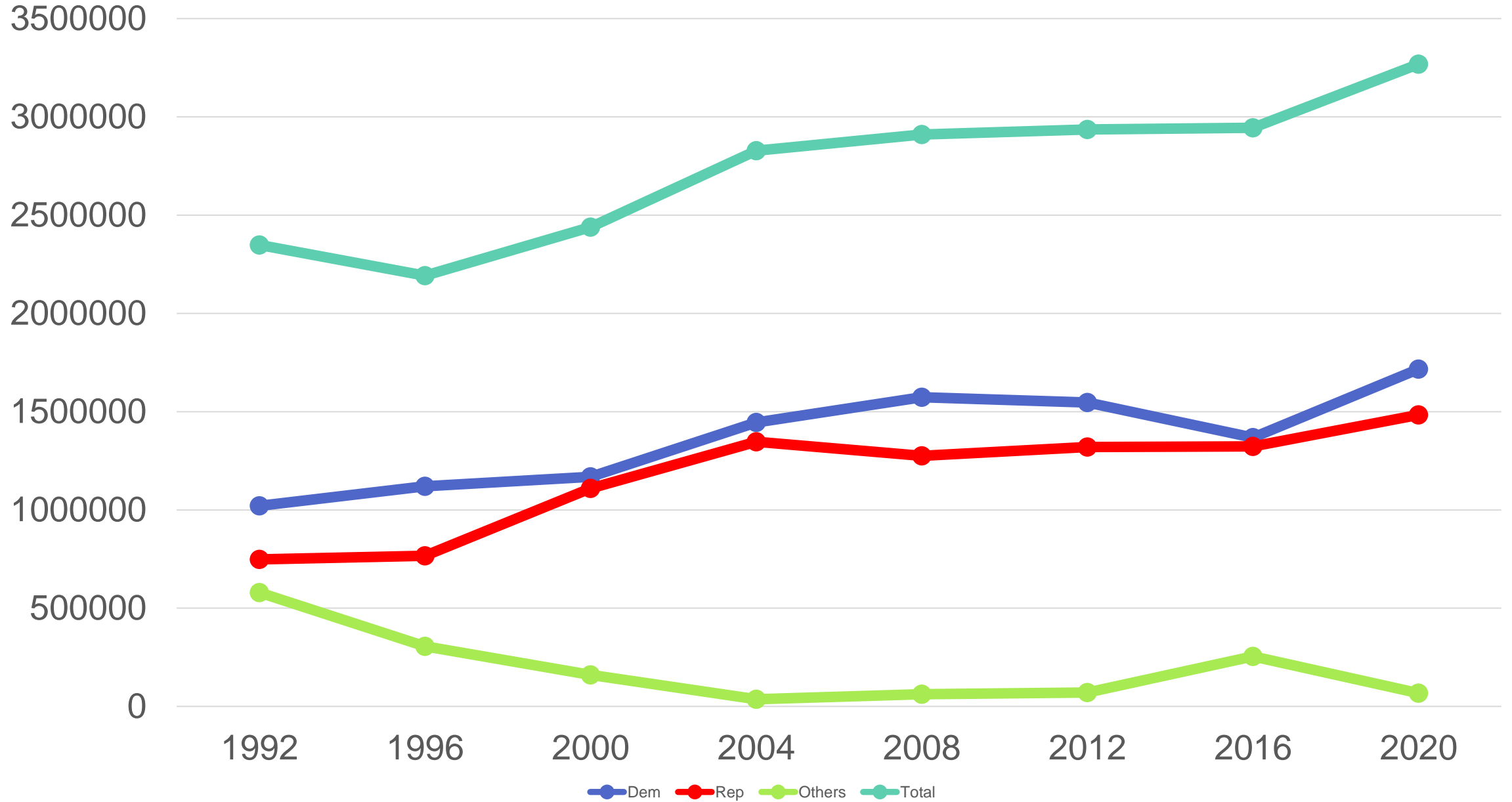
During the recount, the MN SOS allowed election officials at the local level **to contact absentee voters whose ballots had been properly rejected** so as **to allow those absentee voters to correct their errors.**

Of the approximately 1000 Absentee Ballots corrected,

Franken received a net gain of 176 more votes than Coleman.

In 2010, the MN Legislature passed legislation that expanded ballot boards and codified the requirement that election judges contact absentee voters to allow them to correct errors.

How did we get here- MN ?

April, 2020: **MN Legislature rejected SOS Simon's request for the irrevocable power to alter election law during a pandemic. This fact differentiates MN from other states.**

May, 2020: **Democrat activists' groups filed suits against Democrat MN SOS demanding the changes to the law he had sought. Ignoring the Minnesota Constitution and Separation of Power issues, MN SOS Simon, represented by Democrat AG Ellison, entered into consent decrees with their supporters to obliterate long-standing election law. *The MNGOP via its attorney failed to intervene in a timely manner. The consent decree was approved by the court prior to the first hearing on the matter.***

Those overly broad consent decrees were approved by judges.

Elections are rapidly changing

Consent Decrees:

- LaRose v. Simon - June 17, 2020
 - Removed witness requirement for mail voters in Primary
 - Extended the deadline to accept mail ballots (2 days)
- NAACP v. Simon - June 23, 2020
 - Removed witness requirement for mail voters in General
 - Extended the deadline to accept mail ballots (7 days)
 - MN Supreme Court Appeal scheduled for September 3, 2020
- DSCC v. Simon - July 30, 2020
 - Eliminated the number of voters a person can assist when voting

Minnesota Constitution

ARTICLE III DISTRIBUTION OF THE POWERS OF GOVERNMENT

Section 1. Division of powers.

The powers of government shall be divided into three distinct departments: **legislative, executive and judicial**. **No person or persons belonging to or constituting one of these departments shall exercise any of the powers properly belonging to either of the others except in the instances expressly provided in this constitution.**

MN Stat. 203B121 Ballot Boards

Subd 2- Duties of Ballot Board; absentee ballots

- Upon receipt from the county auditor, municipal clerk, or school district clerk, two or more members of the ballot board shall examine each signature envelope and shall mark it accepted or rejected in the manner provided in this subdivision.

Subd 3. Record of voting

- When applicable, the county auditor or municipal clerk must immediately record that a voter's absentee ballot has been accepted...In a state primary, general, or state special election for federal or state office, the auditor or clerk must also record this information in the statewide voter registration system.

The deadline to complete the Voter History would have been Dec 14th, 2021.

- MN Statutes 201.171 POSTING VOTING HISTORY; FAILURE TO VOTE; REGISTRATION REMOVED. Within six weeks after every election, the county auditor shall post the voting history for every person who voted in the election.

- MN Statutes 201.27 VIOLATIONS, PENALTY.

Subdivision 1. Intentional violation. No officer, deputy, clerk, or other employee shall intentionally:

(1) fail to perform or enforce any of the provisions of this chapter except subdivision 2;
.....An individual who violates this subdivision is guilty of a felony.

We were reviewing ISD 191 Voter Histories from the 2021 election, and discovered a significant mismatch. According to the MN SOS web site 2021 election results, there were 1249 ballots cast. Working with the MN SOS Voter History File Dated 12/21/2021 for ISD shows only 40 voter histories updated in the SVRS for that race. The deadline to complete the work would have been Dec 14th, 2021. There is a possibility that the county may have filed an extension, but that deadline would have only been extended to Jan 11th, 2022. The MN SOS Voter History dated 1/30/2022 file shows only 52 voter histories updated. This is a clear violation of the law.

206.89 POSTELECTION REVIEW OF VOTING SYSTEMS.

Subd. 2. **Selection for review; notice.**

At the canvass of the state primary, the county canvassing board in **each county must set the date, time, and place for the postelection review** of the state general election to be held under this section. The postelection review must not begin before the 11th day after the state general election and must be complete no later than the 18th day after the state general election...

The county auditor **must notify the secretary of state of the precincts** that have been **chosen** for review **and the time and place the postelection review for that county will be conducted,...** **The secretary of state must post this information on the office website.**

PER 206.89.Subd. 5. Additional review (cont.)

(a) If the postelection review in one of the reviewed precincts **reveals a difference greater than one-half of one percent**, or greater than two votes in a precinct where 400 or fewer voters cast ballots, **the postelection review official must, within two days, conduct an additional review** of the races indicated in subdivision 3 **in at least three precincts** in the same jurisdiction where the discrepancy was discovered. If all precincts in that jurisdiction have been reviewed, the county auditor **must immediately** publicly select by lot at least **three additional precincts for review**. The postelection review official must **complete the additional review within two days** after the precincts are selected and report the results immediately to the county auditor. **If the second review in any of the reviewed precincts also indicates a difference in the vote totals** compiled by the voting system that is **greater than one-half of one percent from the result indicated by the postelection review**, or greater than two votes in a precinct where 400 or fewer voters cast ballots, the **county auditor must conduct a review of the ballots from all the remaining precincts in the county** for the races indicated in subdivision 3. **This review must be completed, and the results must be reported to the secretary of state within one week after the second review was completed.**

ARTICLE VII ELECTIVE FRANCHISE

Sec. 8. Election returns to secretary of state; board of canvassers.

The returns of every election for officeholders elected statewide shall be made to the secretary of state who shall call to his assistance two or more of the judges of the supreme court and two disinterested judges of the district courts. They shall constitute a board of canvassers to canvass the returns and declare the result within three days after the canvass.

“If this Court does not take action to prevent the certification of the Minnesota election until a complete, bi-partisan statewide audit of the election occurs, including election materials, our election system, and the trust of the voters, will be irreparably harmed.”

The MN State Canvassing Board is the sole entity identified in the MN Constitutional duty to canvass the statewide election results. Its members were each properly served.

MN Supreme Court ruled that EVERY county in MN had to have been served.

Case was dismissed on Friday afternoon, 12/4/2020, with no hearing on the facts.

Dismissal was the only way to ensure Minnesota would not miss the safe harbor deadline in DC on December 8, 2020.

15.2 ABSENTEE VOTING HISTORY

Within six weeks after every election, the county auditor must post voting history for every person who voted in the election. Registered absentee voters will have history added through the precinct polling place roster. AB election day registrants will have their voter registration applications entered together with those who registered at the polling place on election day. ([M.S. 201.171](#))

15.2.1 Processing Rosters

If absentee balloting is administered without the aid of SVRS, history must be posted manually using a scanner and roster barcodes. When administrators use SVRS to manage absentee voting, the system can be used to apply absentee voting history for those pre-registered voters with accepted ballots. Rather than scanning the paper roster pages manually, a simple button click will mark the post voting history (PVH) roster "A.B." for all voters on the roster with an accepted absentee ballot.


Before beginning the posting process in the Post Voting History module, ensure that all absentee ballots for the precinct are marked 'accepted' or 'rejected' in SVRS. (Only those voters with a ballot in "Accepted" status will have the "A.B." notation added to the PVH roster.) Once all ballots have been marked, use the Apply Accepted AB/MB History button to apply AB history to the precinct's roster. 

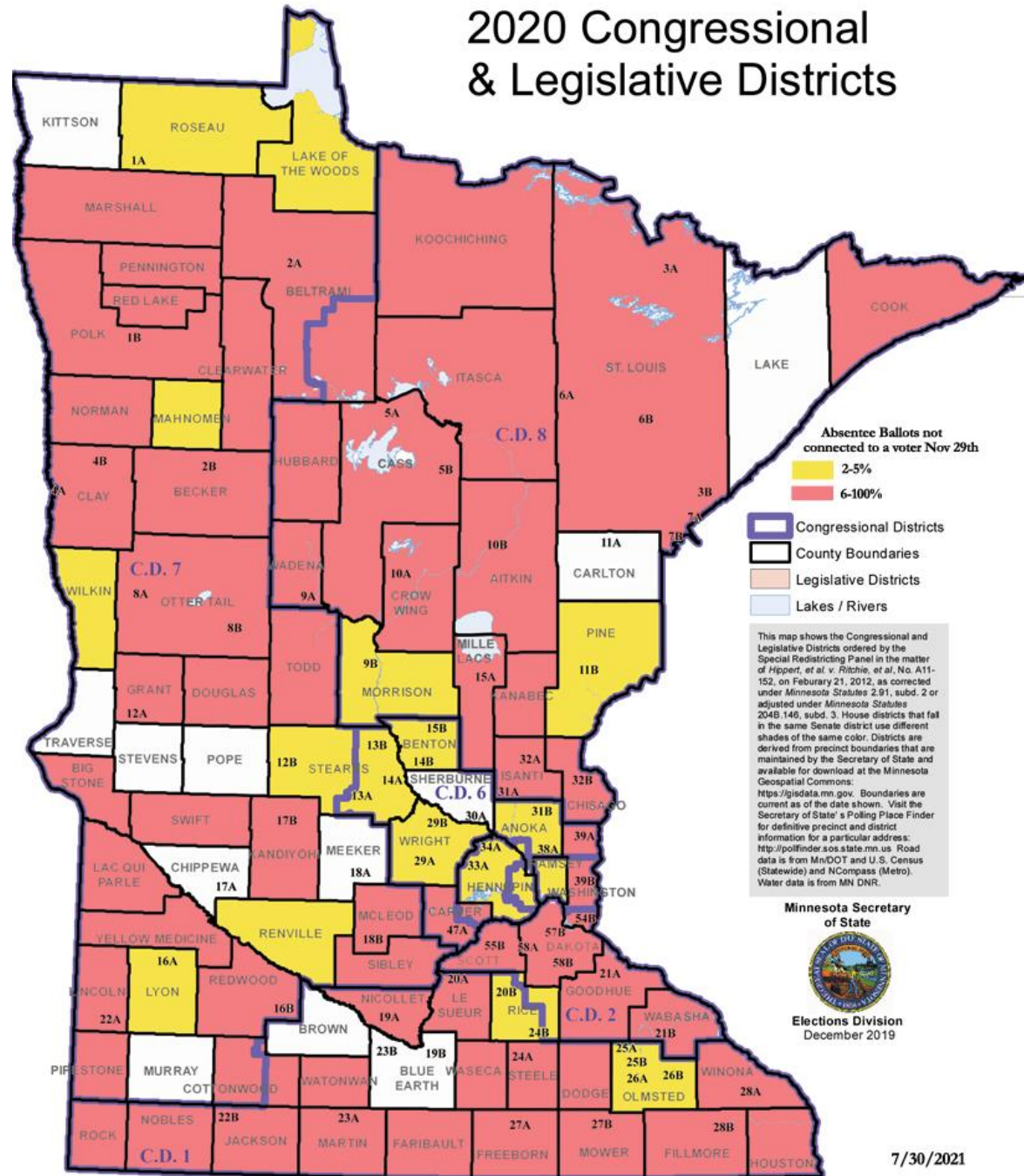

2020 Congressional & Legislative Districts



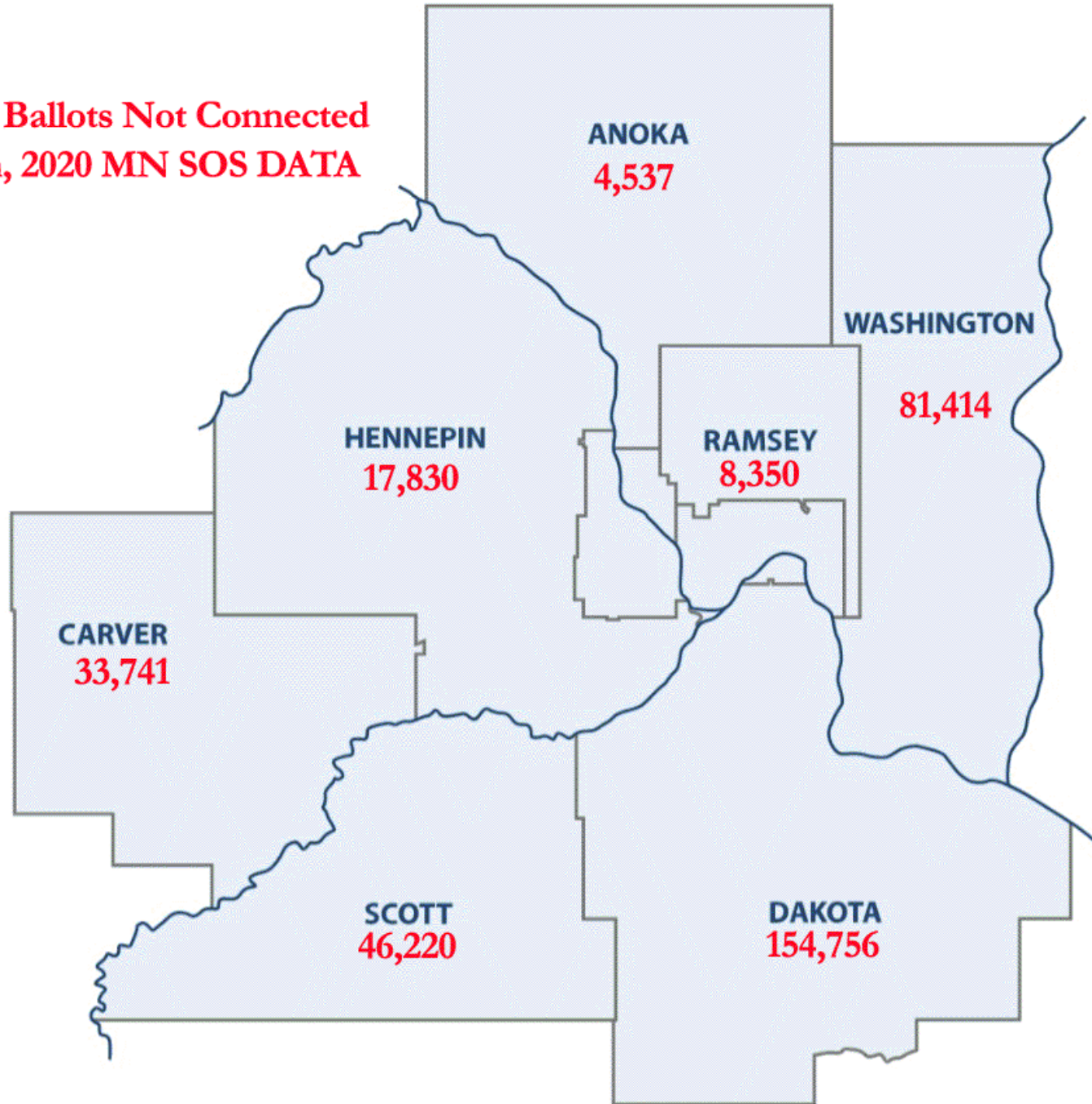

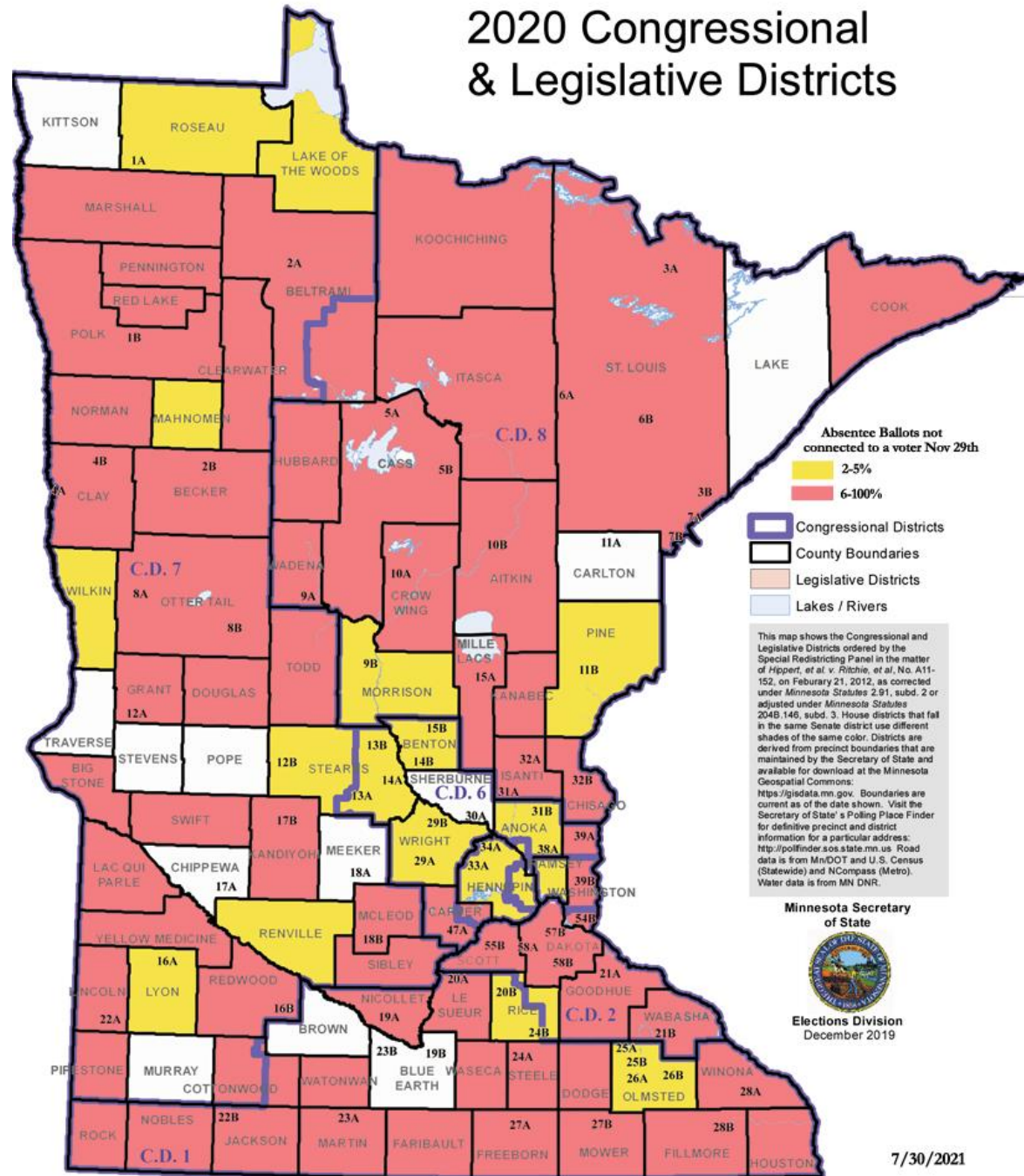

In addition to the requirements in subdivision 1, **a voting system must be certified by an independent testing authority accredited by the Election Assistance Commission or appropriate federal agency responsible for testing and certification of compliance with the federal voting systems guidelines at the time of submission of the application required by subdivision 1 to be in conformity with voluntary voting system guidelines issued by the Election Assistance Commission or other previously referenced agency.** The application must be accompanied by the certification report of the voting systems test laboratory. A certification under this section from an independent testing authority accredited by the Election Assistance Commission or other previously referenced agency meets the requirement of Minnesota Rules, part [8220.0350](#), item L. **A vendor must provide a copy of the source code for the voting system to the secretary of state. A chair of a major political party or the secretary of state may select, in consultation with the vendor, an independent third-party evaluator to examine the source code to ensure that it functions as represented by the vendor and that the code is free from defects.** A major political party that elects to have the source code examined must pay for the examination. Except as provided by this subdivision, a source code that is trade secret information must be treated as nonpublic information, according to section [13.37](#). A third-party evaluator must not disclose the source code to anyone else.

SAINT PAUL — Minnesota Secretary of State Steve Simon's Elections Director, Gary Poser, has been selected to be the new Chair of a multi-state consortium aimed at improving the accuracy of state voter rolls and increasing outreach to unregistered voters.

Poser was voted unanimously today to be the Chair of the Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) at its annual Board of Directors meeting in Washington, D.C. Poser previously served on the board of ERIC. ERIC provides Minnesota election officials with information derived from comparisons of Minnesota's voter rolls to Minnesota's driver's license database, the Social Security Administration's death information, and other states' voter rolls.

"This is a great opportunity for Gary and for Minnesota to lead a national effort to improve state voter rolls and continue to protect the integrity of our nation's elections," said Minnesota Secretary of State Steve Simon. **"I'm incredibly proud of Gary for his hard work and dedication, and know that he will continue to establish Minnesota as a national leader in election reform and administration."**

Minnesota became an official ERIC member on August 1, 2014, after legislation passed during the 2014 legislation session that gave Minnesota permission to join the organization.

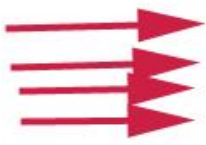
Currently, Washington, D.C. and 11 states are members of ERIC: Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, Louisiana, Maryland, Minnesota, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Virginia, and Washington.

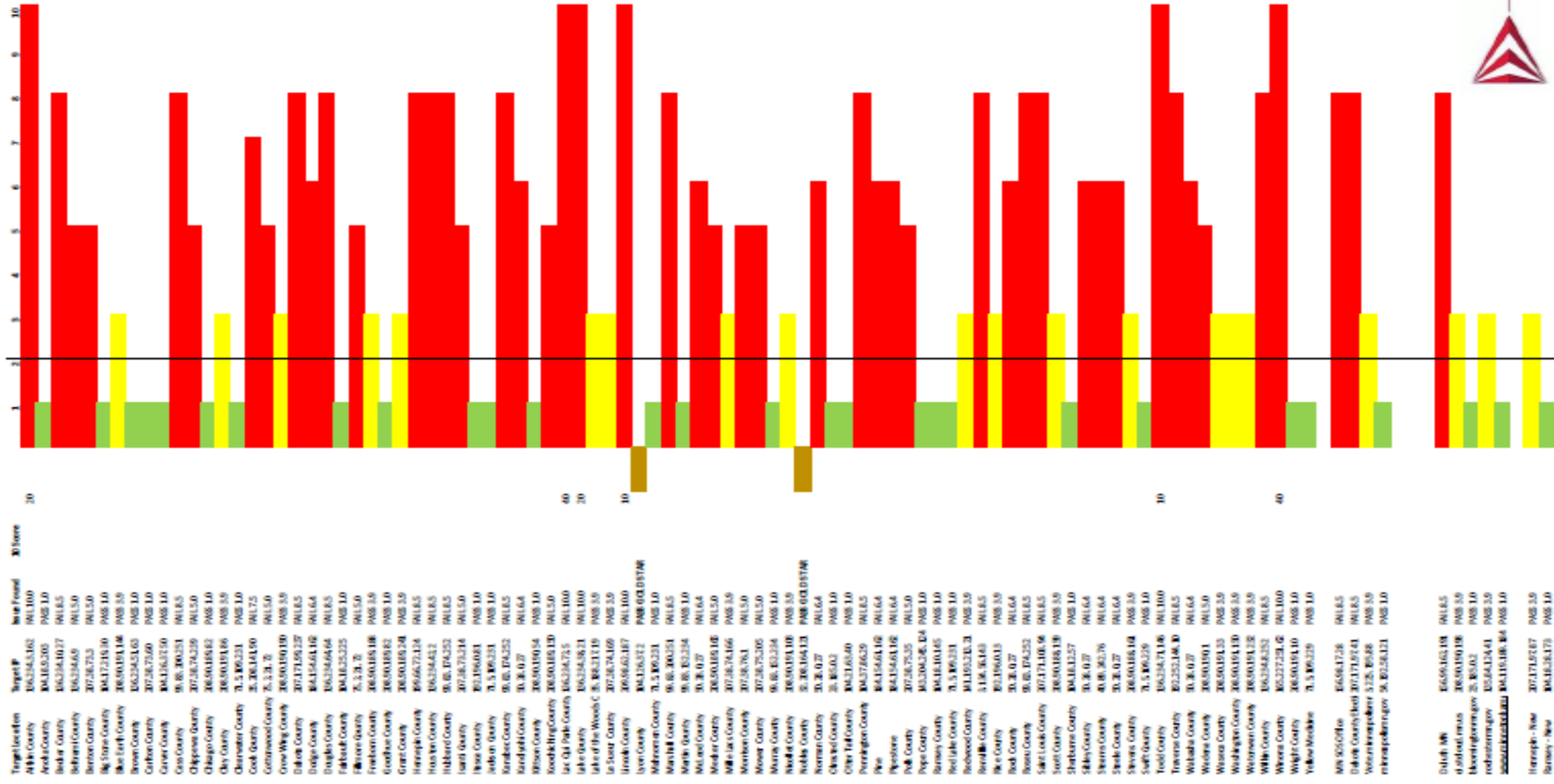

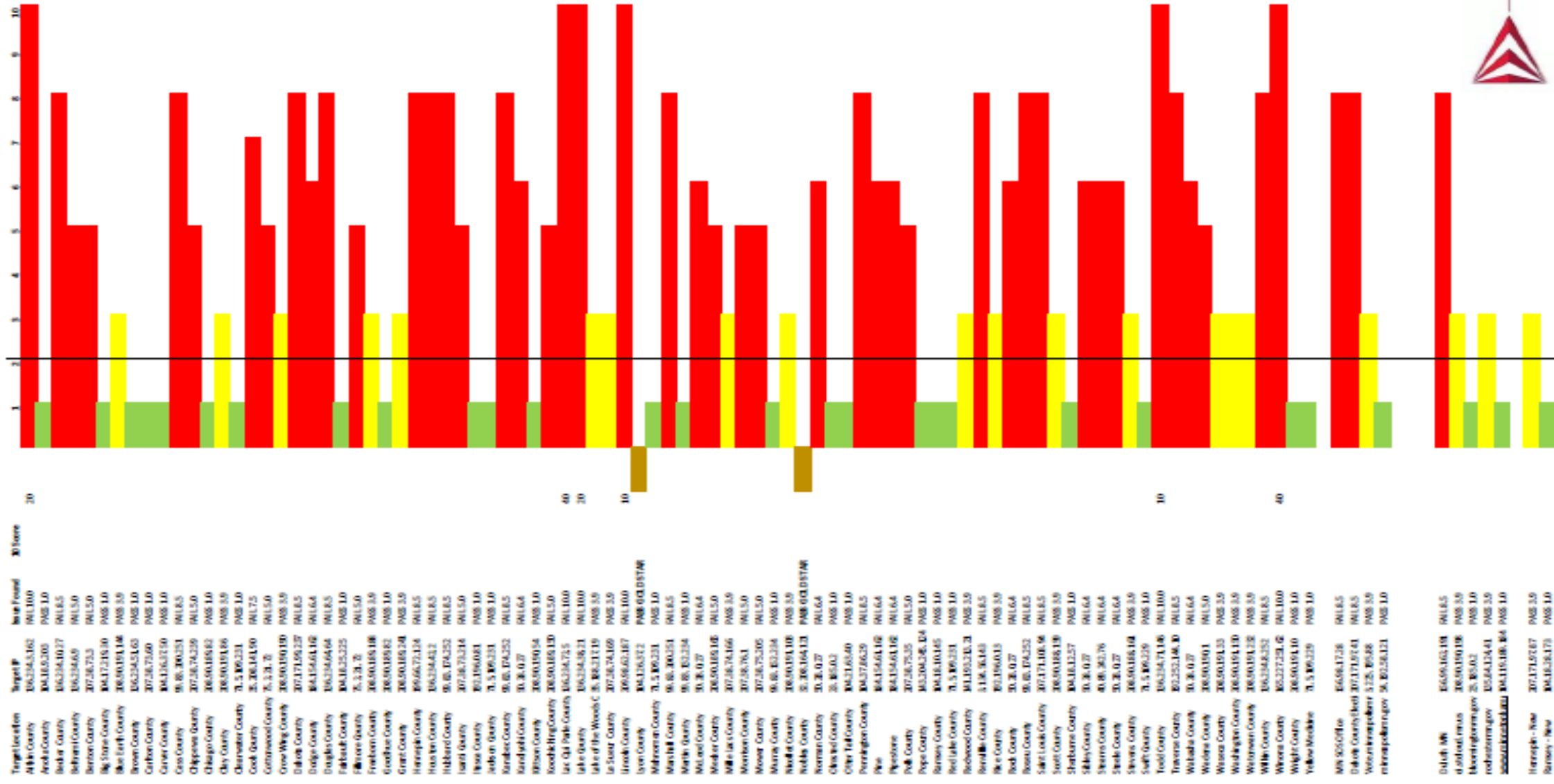

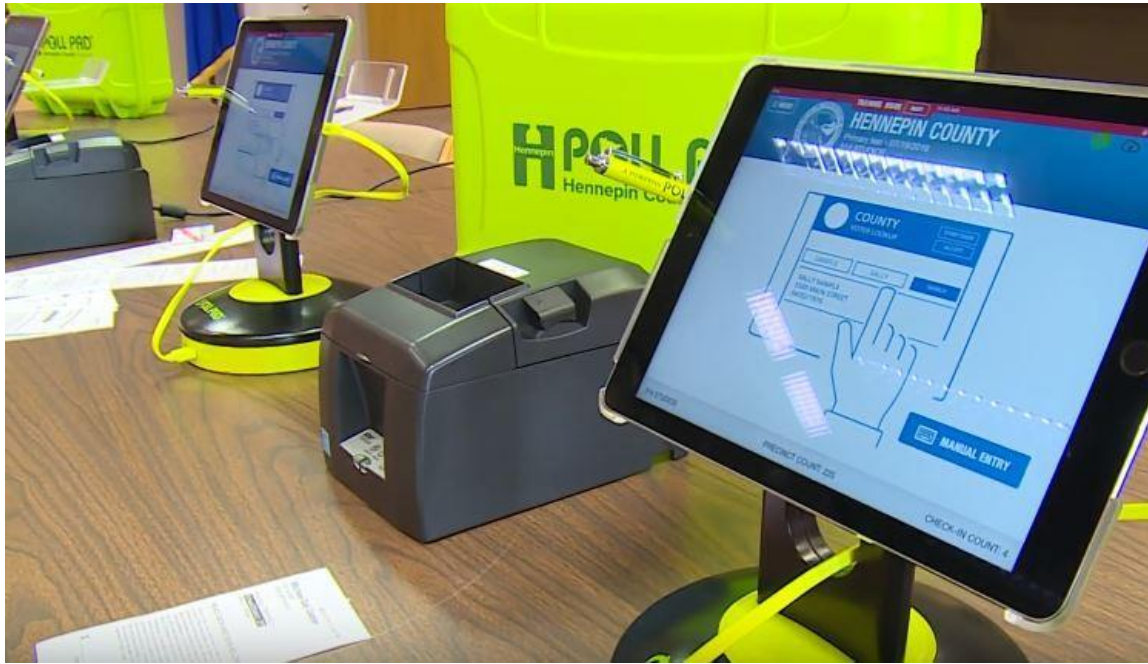

MN Recommendations

- 1) Voter History Deadline - Friday at noon, week of election.
- 2) Voter Histories available for free download by candidates by 3:00 pm Friday.
- 3) Allow 2 weeks before County Certification.
- 4) Allow 2 weeks before State Wide Canvass, only after all Counties are complete.
- 5) Include SOS as part of election contests, then they would notify candidates of election contests.

Election Integrity Goals

- 1) Require State or Federal Govt. issued ID for voting; Free State Issued ID for voting.
- 2) End vouching;
- 3) 14 days of Absentee voting time, except military;
- 4) No Drop Boxes;
- 5) Remove Mail in Ballots, In-Person only, except military;
- 6) Removal of Poll Books, Paper Registrations Only;

Election Integrity Goals

- 7) Only relatives or court appointed guardians can help a person vote: staff member of facilities not allowed to help vote;
- 8) Restore Party Balance at Ballot Boards: Change MN Stat to require representation proportional to vote in last statewide election; don't allow city or county employees to be used.
- 9) No County or State Canvass completed until all voter histories are updated. Any discrepancies MUST be included in canvass report.
- 10) Election Contests challenge deadline extended to 21 days after all voter histories are completed.
