- Teresa Stover, Hydrant Grant Administrator provided a verbal and written report with an update to the project. The RFP opening happened on 10/8/24 and we received two proposals. A preliminary selection was made and the contract is currently under development.

- Director Binker echoed those comments and urged everyone reach out for whatever help they need.



Board of Directors Meeting Operations/Prevention Notes 11/04/2024

The shift schedules are attached.

For October (through the 27<sup>th</sup>), we ran a total of 94 calls.

We had 21 Good intent calls. These are; no incidents found, canceled en-route, smoke investigation, & legal open burns.

We had 5 Service Calls. Public assists, lift assists, gas leaks, water leaks, stand-by, etc.

We had 29 Medical Calls.

We had 20 Illegal Open Burns/Calls. Most of these burns were residents burning legal material during fire season. We had a few residents burning illegal material, which were cited, and the remainder were transient warming fires.

We had I Grass Fire. The fire on Kerby Avenue was unintentional. This was started by an unattended transient warming fire. The fire on Redwood Hwy

We had 3 Structure Fires. The fire on Takilma Road was unintentional. This was a propane heater too close to combustibles. The fire on Rockydale was undetermined. We believe the cause might have been a propane Stove that was left on. The fire on Caves Avenue was unintentional. This was a cooking grease fire.

We had 9 Motor Vehicle Accidents with NO civilian fatalities and NO firefighter injuries.

We assisted our partners with 6 mutual aid calls.

We installed 9 smoke alarms in Valley residences.

We completed 1 fire and life safety inspections.

**S**tation 5 location. The contract with the Grange has just been signed.

I attended the IAAI meeting were discussed the upcoming conference in January and any interesting fire cases.

I attended the two-county operations meeting. The discussion in this meeting was attempting to merge multiple policies and procedures from both counties into one.

I attended the Josephine County operations group meeting. Multiple topics at this meeting to include, radio procedures, radio frequencies, agency updates, fire season successes & failures, and apparatus numbering systems.

On a final note, fire season has ended, and we did not host any large events.

Under new business we have resolution 24-07 that will expand our boundaries to 180 square miles. These are properties we already respond to outside of our current District boundary lines. Exhibit A and B of the resolution shows the boundary expansion and a list of 261 privately owned properties that are not covered by District Fire protection and 106 of those properties currently have some type of improvement on them. We will need a vote on this today



They will provide adequate driveway access or a signed non - compliance letter, thus adhering to the rules of the Oregon Fire Code and the Illinois Valley Fire District.







THIS RESOLUTION IS PURSUANT TO ORS 478.702, WHICH AUTHORIZES RURAL FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICTS TO ESTABLISH COVERAGE AREAS AND PURSUE ANNEXATION OF PROPERTIES NOT CURRENTLY WITHIN ANY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Illinois Valley Rural Fire Protection District is committed to ensuring the safety and protection of all properties within its service area;

**WHEREAS,** under ORS 478.702, rural fire protection districts are authorized to establish a coverage area to provide fire protection services to areas within 7 road miles of a district fire station that are not within a fire district and to annex such properties upon owner consent or future event; and

**WHEREAS,** the Illinois Valley Rural Fire Protection District stations are within 7 road miles of certain properties currently not annexed into the District, but which would benefit from the District's fire protection services; and

**WHEREAS**, no other fire protection districts maintain fire stations within 7 miles of these properties, leaving them otherwise unprotected by a proximate fire service provider; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Directors finds it in the public interest to extend the District's boundaries and coverage to these properties, and to pursue annexation of said properties into the District, ensuring their continued safety and fire protection;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Directors of the Illinois Valley Rural Fire Protection District as follows;

1. Extension of Boundaries and Coverage Area: The District hereby establishes a coverage area to include all properties up to 7 road miles of any IVFD fire station as shown on the map in Exhibit A (Map of Affected Areas) and listed in Exhibit B

(List of Affected Properties).

- 2. Notification and Annexation Process: The District directs staff to notify the owners of the properties listed in Exhibit A of their inclusion into the District's coverage area. The notification shall inform property owners of their option to annex into the District, as provided by ORS 478.702.
- 3. Annexation Option: Property owners shall be given the option to petition for annexation into the District, with staff prepared to assist in completing any necessary documentation for the annexation process in accordance with state law.
- 4. If the district does not receive consent from the owners as described in ORS 478.702, the district will still protect the owners' lands and, if the district provides services at the lands, will bill the owners at three times the cost of the services.
- 5. Effective Date: This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Board of Directors.



**SUBJECT: Hydrant Project Status Report** 

DATE: November 1, 2024

The IVFD water and sewer lines expansion will install approximately 1,700 lineal feet each of water and sewer lines from existing City of Cave Junction main lines on Old Stage Road to the Illinois Valley Fire District Station 1 at 681 Caves Highway (see attached drawings). Four fire hydrants will be installed along the water line; three on Caves Highway and one on the fire station back lot.

IVFD is managing the design, engineering, and construction of the project. Upon completion, IVFD will hand off operation and maintenance of the lines to the City of Cave Junction. The project is funded by an Oregon Lottery direct legislative award, as administered by Business Oregon. The Business Oregon deadline to complete the project is March 2027.

#### Procurement

- o In response to the Request for Proposal (RFP) for design engineering services published on September 17, we received and opened two qualified proposals at the proposal opening meeting on October 8. The proposals were evaluated and both firms were interviewed. A preliminary selection has been made and the contract is under development.
- Next steps are to complete contract negotiations, have the contract reviewed by IVFD legal counsel and by Business Oregon, and then issue the Notice of Intent to Award Contract in mid- to late November.

#### Permits and regulatory approvals

ODOT requires the Utility Permit Cultural Resource Review Notification to three tribal nations: Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde, Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians, and Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians. Tribal notifications went out on September 10 and the deadline for responses was October 10. None of the tribes notified us of any objections or other comments, so we can now move forward with the ODOT Utility Permit Cultural Resource Certification.
