### **Brent Care Journeys \* Bulletin 6 \* July 2022**


#### <u>Team</u>

Whilst acknowledging the flexibility and convenience that 'working from anywhere' can bring, there are some implications which need taking care of. I was delighted therefore that the BCJ team took me up on the offer of a well-earned team lunch in the sun; bringing our focus on relational working right into the heart of our time with one another.



Our Assistant Project workers, Donald and Anthony, have gone from strength to strength this month. They have maximised the support from their service design coach by testing their codesigned group sessions for real. This enabled them to try out the concepts they had devised and gain further feedback from young people who attended.

Donald has devised a creative wellbeing space. In his first session he asked participants scaling questions about the kind of day they were having, then supported them to access a range of art materials to express this. At the end of his session there was poignant group discussion about what had been created. I witnessed Donald crafting an honest, safe and touching environment in which he put people at ease. I also observed the way in which he was able to relate to his group members with incisive relevance and unspoken understanding.







The concept for Anthony's group came from a prevailing call from older care leavers that they are afraid of full independence when their cases are closed. Anthony's ambition is to support lasting connection and solidarity amongst people who have grown up together and who have voiced the need for a forum. Through his prior research he identified activities that have previously, and continue to, bring the group together. This helped Anthony to develop the concept of a games club. Further research enabled interrogation of video and board game options. When I innocently asked why people would come together to play video games (given that they can play remotely from home), Anthony articulated the pivotal fact that they have never met *in real life*, therefore articulating the heart of his concept. And from this 'TOGETHER IRL' was born.

#### **Service Design and Systems Change**

A co-designer, Rhiannon and I had the pleasure of sharing information about the Welcome Pack with a number of boroughs, including Ealing, Richmond and Wandsworth, Hounslow, Southwark, Hammersmith and Fulham, Barking and Dagenham, and Bromley. It was wonderful to have Brent CRT's Jacqui Jennings there to endorse how Brent are now leading the way with this change – not only by implementing the welcome pack, but in the culture of developing change with young people as active protagonists. Our next step is to invite these boroughs to a designated session in which we may support this change more widely.

Our second co-design phase with Brent staff is drawing to a close, with group members testing their prototype ideas and gathering data from which to make recommendations. First up to present to the board this coming Monday is Afzal, Jyoti and Tanya. They codesigned with five care leavers to explore issues around staff retention. One young person spoke with particular articulation regarding the impact on him when his social worker left. The relational aspect of their work together had meant so much to this young man; they had bonded over activities that they had both loved – in their case it was football. The prototype is therefore about how staff wellbeing and job satisfaction can be enhanced by creating resource and capacity for activities which develop bonds.

#### **Here and Now**

In addition to the above, in the last four weeks we have enjoyed

- Facilitating **four** workshops in partnership with the Kiln developing and presenting the opportunity to cocreate an original piece of theatre with Brent's young people.
- Spending **four** days voice and visual recording for our promotional film. (Watch this space!)
- Bowling for one afternoon to support new engagements, and
- Braving horse riding on two separate occasions.



As if that was not enough, we were also proud to represent Brent's care experienced young people at the Houses of Parliament. We sat in Westminster Hall waiting for MPs to leave the Commons following PMQs. We were delighted to talk to Clive Efford (MP Enfield) about structural support for young people working towards independence and to Karin Smyth (MP Bristol South) who said she was a good friend of Dawn Butler (MP Brent, currently unwell) and would share our case for change with her. It was a shame that Barry Gardiner (MP Brent) was not in the House that day, but we have written to him suggesting that he may like to meet with us in future. A real highlight for BCJ was a tour of the Houses of Parliament, including an opportunity to sit in the public gallery and listen to Jonathan Ashworth (Shadow Sec State for work and pensions) debating Universal Credit and the rising cost of living.
