Salem History

"1884"

In the summer of 1884, the newspapers of our nation were filled, as they have been in 1984, with the news of a presidential election year. In what proved to be a bitterly fought, close election Grover Cleveland defeated James Blair, and returned a democrat to the white house after 24 years of republican occupancy.

Denver's newspapers were no exception to the national rule. On Sunday, July 13th, both the <u>Rocky Mountain News</u> and the <u>Denver Republican</u> headline stories concerning the recent nomination of Grover Cleveland and his running mate Thomas Hendricks at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago. The leaders of Denver's German- American community were quoted as being "pleased" by Cleveland's nomination.

Other stories grabbing space that summer Sunday included the cloudburst in Boulder Canyon that claimed 14 lives on Saturday, grim reports of the Cholera epidemic that was sweeping Europe, an article reporting the adoption of "Standard Time" by the US Congress, and an approving editorial on the newly organized Denver Chamber of Commerce. Silver was selling for \$1.09 an ounce in New York, and men's oxford shoes were advertised for \$3.75 a pair.

Buried within the <u>Denver Republican</u>, on the page reserved for church news, was this short-terse announcement:

"German Services - A German sermon will be delivered by Rev. J.H. Bierbaum at Reno Hall."

Reno Hall was located on the southwest corner of 27th and Holloday, the first street north of Larimer. This time, the text, and the attendance of that first sermon are regretfully lost now. Both pastor and people have gone to their eternal reward. Yet, their beginning was our beginning; their hopedfor future is our celebrated heritage – for this simple meeting marked the founding of the <u>Evangelische Salem's Gemeinde</u>.
