Farewell Discourse

I was leading music at a week-long summer church camp in 1999, and the week was just underway when I was called to the phone in the mess hall during breakfast. The caller informed me that my dad had collapsed, was unresponsive in the hospital, and it didn't look good. I needed to come back home.

As I drove, I thought of the last time I saw my dad. I had a runny nose and didn't want to give him a cold in his weakened state. So, I kept my distance and told him why. He nodded that he understood, his oxygen tube draping to the floor, but there was a sad look in his eyes for the hug we didn't share. I told him that I loved him and would see him at the end of the week.

Dad had been ill and declining for some time. What if this was the last time, I talked with him? Would I regret not hugging him? Did he know I loved him? I wasn't always the best at telling him that, even though I knew our time together was getting short.

It turned out that it <u>was</u> the last conversation we had. He had no more brain activity, and mom and I took him off life support a few days later, as we knew he wished. We spent a long time with his cooling body, talking and sharing, praying, and crying—holy stuff. It was a painful, hard time in my life, and even now when I think of him, I miss him so very dearly.

Saying goodbye is hard stuff. It's also holy stuff. And when a pastor in the UCC leaves a ministry, the guidelines call for no contact between the pastor and parishioners for a minimum of 2 years, which is also hard. For some of us, that 2 years will end up being forever. Hopefully we've said our goodbyes by the time you've read this. Hopefully you know that I love you and tried to do the best I could in ministry to you and all the people of Salem. Hopefully you, and I, and Salem may move forward where God needs each of us to go, even if we don't yet know where that is.

The book of John, chapters 14-17 are often called Jesus' "Farewell Discourse." It's what Jesus told his followers before he was taken away to be tortured and killed. Most of the disciples didn't get what was going on at the time; like my last conversation with my dad, they didn't realize this was their last time with Jesus. But Jesus' goodbye stuck with them enough to be written down so we might read it even in this day. It's a reminder of love, of blessing, and of moving forward after "goodbye."

As I say goodbye to you, I share a nugget from that Farewell Discourse, John 15:12, where Jesus says:

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

So, I remind you as I have so many times before, from the heart: Love God, love one another, and love your enemy, for love always wins, even after we say goodbye.

Goodbye.

Emergency Salem Congregational Meeting was held on December 12th after church. Thirty people were in attendance in house and on Zoom. The purpose of the meeting was to vote on a proposal of the Nominating Committee. Michael Stice spoke to the requirements for the vote to be taken. Kathy Carroll on behalf of the Nominating Committee moved to accept the proposal of a new Emergency Leadership Council by the Congregation. Information was given. People were given time to ask questions and receive clarification, to give opinion and to vote. 30 votes were cast, 22 yes, 2 no, and 6 abstain. The Motion passed.

The ELC will consist of 5 members. At the time of the meeting, Krissy Berry, Lori Carroll. Kathy Baird and Beth Hansen have agreed to serve. The 5th position is still open. The ELC will organize, choose a leader and a clerk to be obtained. The Ministries will continue to serve the Church and give reports to the ELC. In June, this process will be evaluated. The Conference will provide leadership for the healing and future building of Salem.

Thanks was expressed to God and to all who worked to create this proposal and to those who participated.


