As our Spiritual Discernment Process is in a place of looking deeper into the questions of "What is church in 2022, anyway?" and "Why is Salem UCC a church, rather than anything else?", I want to share with you this piece called "Love Each Other" by Presbyterian minister and prolific, unapologetic spiritual writer, Frederick Buechner. We contemplated it in last Sunday's discernment session, and I thought it might be helpful to share it again here:

Matthew the tax-collector and Thomas the doubter.

Peter the Rock and Judas the traitor.

Mary Magdalene and Lazarus's sister Martha.

And the popcorn-crunching woman in the movie theater.

And the man in the pick-up.

They are all our family, and you and I are their family and each other's family, because that is what Jesus has called us as the Church to be.

Our happiness is all mixed up with each other's happiness and our peace with each other's peace. Our own happiness, our own peace, can never be complete until we find some way of sharing it with people who the way things are now have no happiness and know no peace.

Jesus calls us to show this truth forth, live this truth forth.

Be the light of the world, he says. Where there are dark places, be the light especially there.

Be the salt of the earth. Bring out the true flavor of what it is to be alive truly. Be truly alive.

Be life-givers to others. That is what Jesus tells the disciples to be.

That is what Jesus tells his Church, tells us, to be and do.

Love each other. Heal the sick, he says.

Raise the dead. Cleanse lepers. Cast out demons.

That is what loving each other means.

If the Church is doing things like that, then it is being what Jesus told it to be.

If it is not doing things like that—no matter how many other good and useful things it may be doing instead—then it is not being what Jesus told it to be. It is as simple as that.

I would invite each of you that have both a heart for, and some concern for Salem UCC to ponder the above questions, pray about them, take some daily silence, and see what comes in response by Spirit. Take notes. Find someone to share with, or, best yet come and join us in our next discernment session after worship on July 10th.

As I posted in my discernment update on Tuesday, the next 4 discernment session dates are: Sunday, July 10th and 24th, and Sunday, August 14th and 28th.

Finance

At the Congregational meeting held on Sunday, June 19, it was brought up that people would like to know more about Salem's Financial health, procedures regarding who "touches" the money and /or has access to our accounts and who makes sure bills and payroll are paid. I thought this was great opportunity to share that information.

Financial Health –

We are doing fine financially. Thanks to your continued generosity during this time of transition and discernment our bank accounts are as follows ~

- 1. Operating \$25,018,
- 2. Crisp \$72,170,
- 3. Memorial \$12,011,
- 4. KS rewards or Grocery Cert. \$ 7,475
- 5. Community Meals \$902.

All our bills and payroll have been paid on time even given we have lost internet twice in the last month; even to handwriting paychecks.

Procedures:

- ~ Roger Neumann is our Offertory Manager. He picks up all the checks, cash and rentals from the church weekly, deposits them and records the information on giving statements which are then distributed after the end of each quarter. He is really the only person who "touches" the money.
- ~ Ani Martinez is our bookkeeper. She is in the church twice a month, usually the first and third weekends. She is responsible for recording the deposits, paying all bills most of which are online or direct pay from our bank which is US Bank. She is responsible for completing payroll which is paid out on the 25th of each month at the request of our employees to facilitate budgeting on their part. She is responsible for reconciling all 5

accounts and our credit card. responsible for completing reimbursement requests which have been submitted and signed off on by the appropriate ministries. She usually texts the individual that their check is ready and available for pickup from Lisa Thomas, our Admin. Assistant or mails the check if requested. And she is responsible for completing all Federal, state and city employee tax requirements which are done at the end of each quarter.

Chris Johnson has continued to oversee these activities.

- ~Reimbursements ~ If someone has spent their own money, they can request reimbursement by completing the following steps:
- 1. Receive approval from the SLC (this used to be handled by the ministry heads and is done so we know what money is used out of different budgeted areas).
- 2. Purchase approved item(s) making sure to retain a receipt.
- 3. Fill out a reimbursement form located on top of the lateral file in the office, attaching the receipt and indicating the ministry area and who approved.
- 4. Place the form with attached receipt in the appropriate folder on the lateral file.
- 5. Receive your reimbursement check after the next working weekend Ani is there.
- ~ Funds Transfer ~ Chris Johnson, as treasurer has overseen this. With the Dissolution of our Church Council and establishment of our ELC now SLC they have the authority to authorize the transfer of funds for the purpose of keeping enough money in the Operating budget to pay our bulls and meet our payroll. Or with regards to a special project that had been approved previously by church council, this was paid for from our Memorials.

~ Credit Card ~ Salem now has its own credit card through US Bank. Pam Neumann has one of the cards as she does the majority of the food purchases for our functions. Lisa Thomas has access to the second and she has authorization to complete almost anything else that the church as a whole wishes to purchase, i.e... curriculum, office. bathroom/kitchen supplies etc. Ani also has access to the second card to use in paying for invoiced items such as tree trimming, and our Denver Property taxes. We do earn a percentage back on our purchases which goes back into the operating account. Since this is the first year that we have had this credit card available, we are in the process of seeing what we will be able to add to our account.
