As I write this, I am preparing to preach tomorrow at the Evergreen Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). The service is part of the Evergreen Jazz Festival that runs during the last weekend of July. This is the third time I've been invited to do this, and it always is a challenge. How do you draw a connection between music (and jazz in particular) and God's Gospel? For that matter, how do you draw a connection between any art form and the proclamation of God's good news? Let me share a little about what I have come to believe.

For tomorrow's sermon I selected a text from Mark's Gospel, chapter 7, and verses 31-37. I urge you to read it for yourself but here it is in brief. Jesus is near a place called the Decapolis expanding his ministry beyond the familiar territory of Galilee when a group approaches him with a man who has a speech impediment, due to severe hearing loss. We don't know why they bring the man to Jesus. Are they his friends concerned about his impairment? Or are they some of Jesus' antagonists, seeing if this Jewish rabbi would heal a Gentile? The story doesn't say. What it does tell us is that Jesus pulls the man away from the group and in what looks like a private ritual, heals the man of his impediment, thus restoring his wholeness and his ability to fully participate in the social life of his community.

In the center of the story are Jesus' words: Be Opened! The message is clear—that God through Jesus has the power to open up the ears of a deaf man so that he can hear and speak well. For the first ones to listen to this story, this was a fulfillment of Isaiah's vision of life in God's Realm— "then the eyes of the blind shall be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy!"

What might this mean for us? I believe the story invites us to recall those moments when someone opened our (metaphorical) "ears" to new life, new loves, new depths of insight about our relationship to one another and to God. Since this sermon will be in the context of a jazz festival, I will tell the story of my first experience of jazz music. I was taking guitar lessons from two brothers who lived down the street from me. Billy and Bobby Bradley were a little older than me; both of them were afflicted with muscular dystrophy and were confined to their wheelchairs. They were very talented musicians in their own right and owned one of the biggest record collections in town. When I came early to my guitar lesson one day, they were sitting in their living room listening to some kind of music that I found strange and unsettling— "what is THAT?" I asked over the noise. "It's jazz! Do you like it?" "No, not really, what is it?" When Fats Waller was asked that same question he said, "If you have to ask, you'll never know!" The Bradley brothers said simply, "Just listen". So, I did, and tried to understand why people liked it. I started to get it when Bobby said, "Don't worry about it. It's just God messing with your ears".

I certainly understood that. Sometimes God just needs to 'mess with our ears'. Jazz explores the full range of human emotion---lament, 'the blues, or anger then turns it towards deep reflection, even joy! I think discernment can be a time when God 'messes with our ears' by removing whatever it is that blocks our ability to hear then speak our truth. God does this with compassion for us and with concern for our community of faith. God is still speaking! Let's pray that God's Spirit will unblock our ears so that we can hear what God's good news is for us!

Listening to the Voice of God

I think these words from Richard Rohr's daily meditation last Friday are quite timely as we continue our spiritual discernment process together. I share them with you below: Richard Rohr reminds us that when we listen to the voice of God, we are given the grace to "pass it on" to others. If something comes toward us with grace and can pass through us and toward others with grace, we can trust it as the voice of God. Richard tells us:

One holy man who came to visit me recently put it this way, "We must listen to what is supporting us. We must listen to what is encouraging us. We must listen to what is urging us. We must listen to what is alive in us."

If we can trust and listen to our inner divine image, our whole-making instinct, or our True Self, we will act from our best, largest, kindest, most inclusive self. There is a deeper voice of God, which we must learn to hear and obey. It will sound like the voice of risk, of trust, of surrender, of soul, of common sense, of destiny, of love, of an intimate stranger, of your deepest self. It will always feel gratuitous, and it is this very freedom that scares us. God never leads by guilt or shame! God leads by loving the soul at ever-deeper levels, not by shaming at superficial levels.

I'm delighted to be on this journey with you and am encouraged by what is unfolding as we listen together to Spirit. Let us keep listening, and sharing with one another what we hear, sense, and experience, with grace...


