A friend posted this on social media this week: "I was going to give up all my bad habits for the New Year, but then I remembered, No one likes a quitter!" I don't know how many bad habits I have – there are several I can name and probably a few I haven't even recognized yet – but I'm

guessing that most of them will still be here this time next year, too. Experts say that it's easier to create a new habit than to try and eliminate an old one. If we're lucky, in time the new, better habit can



take the place of the old one. In my sermon last Sunday, I talked about how we don't have to go drastic to make a difference.

I can tell you some completely unreasonable goals for this year: I'd love to

go to the gym every day, lose 50 pounds, read a book a week, and more. Honestly, I'd be happy (and realistic) if I walked a mile or two several times a week, ate better, lost 20 pounds, etc.

Little things make a big difference down the road. Like the butterfly effect I talked about in my sermon, little differences do add up. We humans are creatures of habit, and habits are tough to change. Many days, getting through the day is enough without trying to summon the energy to change the world! The trick is to do something small and achievable. One thing I'm doing differently this year is goal setting, to help keep me on track. Small, achievable, incremental. I hope that for 2024, you'll change something for the better. Create a new habit that benefits you and – in turn – those around you. We won't change ourselves or the church or the world overnight. Step out of your comfort zone: Reconnect with a friend. Have a salad. Volunteer. Believe things can be better - because they can. With Love, Pastor Dustin

Our team's primary focus in December was developing a 2024 Preliminary Operating Budget by obtaining accurate, up to date income and expense projections to share with the congregation, formatting financial reports in a transparent, understandable format, and seeking congregational input and ideas for the 2024 budget. Our team will next meet on Wednesday, January 10, 10:30am, at Salem and on Zoom to finalize a 2023 Financial Report and a Proposed 2024 Operating Budget that we will present for a vote at the Annual Congregational meeting on Sunday, January 28. If anyone has further questions or input on the Operating budget, you are encouraged to attend this meeting or contact one of our team members. Other no less important projects that occupied our time were:



- normalizing accounting procedures with Ellis Accounting.
- having our first meeting with the City of Denver about getting a Zone Lot Amendment for the Parsonage and Southwest backyard lots. It was very successful, and the process is moving forward.
- completing a new two-year lease with Christ the King Anglican Church
- preparing the annual update of the Sunflower Childcare lease.
- preparing a new, short-term lease for the Parsonage tenants to be signed in March.
- having the church furnaces checked and serviced.

2023 has been a challenging and exciting year for our team. We look forward to another like it in 2024! (Well, maybe more exciting, less challenging!) We hope everyone will plan on attending the annual Meeting on January 28<sup>th</sup>.
