Salem History "Bradley School"

Sunday, March 18th, 1956, witnessed the last worship service conducted in Pioneer Chapel. The choir sang "Surely He Has Borne Our Griefs", and grief must have been the prevailing emotion as Salem's people prepared to say goodbye to their home of 36 years. The gentle hill at 9th and Sherman is now home to an office building and even the name "Pioneer" resides only in memory as the congregation chose to return to the original "Salem" at its new location.

Final furniture moving was completed by April 10, not to the new building, but to members' homes and garages throughout Denver. A treasured anecdote recalls dropping a piano down the flight of stairs in Schmidt Hall and almost imbedding John Traudt into the plaster wall. What was left of the piano was repaired by Lynn Massa. What was left of John Traudt was revived and sent back to work.

On Palm Sunday members gathered at Bradley Elementary School at East Cornell and Dahlia. What was expected to be only a brief stop became Salem's home for over a year.

Plans for the new church were let for bids in May and on July 22nd, Frohlich Construction Company was instructed to begin immediate construction at a cost of \$76,425. It wasn't until October 28, however, that construction had proceeded far enough to dedicate and lay a cornerstone, containing documents from the Chapel's cornerstone and new documents.

Even in its temporary home Salem made plans for the future. A drop in membership might have been expected but membership actually increased by 16%. Pastor Kieker published a series of articles entitled, "So many have asked..." outlining the purpose and goals of Salem. The young, growing suburban community began to provide a welcome increase in Sunday School.

The time of "exile" was filled with the numerous details of moving a church: raising money, keeping on top of construction, and creating a focus for a far-flung congregation. As members would sometimes "take a swing down Florida" they may have chaffed at the slow progress but must have rejoiced at the prospect of finally having a new home.
