A Word From Pastor Russ

I find myself busy most of the time. Sometimes, though, I have a moment of non-busyness. Sometimes, in those non-busy times, I feel tears well up in my eyes. I feel strong emotions well up in my soul. I feel... overwhelm. I feel it saturating and dripping from my soul, filling me up, overflowing, like it wants to wash me away.

I inhale deeply as if to dry it out, suck it down. I distract myself with something else to stay busy on to hold these feelings at bay. I push it down with food, hold it back with work, run away from it with hobbies. It works for a little while, then those feelings rush back in.

So, I try to look at it logically. I see the reasons I feel this way: constant, grinding tension of a pandemic, all the pain and struggle going on in the world around me, layered over the regular stuff of life that comes and goes. I wonder how I can get past it, over it, around it... And then I find it welling up again in my soul and in my eyes.

It's like gravity: It's always there. I can work against it all day, but over the hours, over the days, over the year, it wears me down. It always wins. Resistance takes work, wears out my soul, and pulls me down. Like gravity, a constant. I'm exhausted from working against it, tired of trying to walk on the sunny side of the street that seems to always be uphill these days. It's like trying to keep a balloon inflated that has a hole in it; some days it might as well be a thousand holes.

And my colleagues all talk of it. They feel this way, too, and I am not alone. And church members have told me they feel the such overwhelm, such exhaustion, such work and worry, such a struggle.

And then—in a surprise moment—I bump into someone I know and just chat to find out I am not alone in these feelings. In an unexpected instant, I find a laugh. During a prayer, I feel bolstered, just a little lift. Or I take a moment to meditate, or to daydream, or discover a tad of hope in my soul. In a moment now and then, I find release from the gravity of our times to float the clouds and fly free.

And sometimes... Sometimes... I just stop and let it all out. I let the overwhelm well up and crash through me. I stop holding on, holding it down, holding to my sanity. I let the saturation go, along with the tears, washing away some of burden of these times. And I thank God for the moment of release, that I may rise and move forward once again.

So, I pray for you when you feel this way. I pray for your overwhelm, your struggles, your stress and exhaustion. I pray that you try not to take it out on others or yourself. I pray that God will hold you close when you weep and when you feel, especially if social distancing keeps loved ones away. And I pray you find your release, your hope, your lift, your gravity-defying moment when you may fly free, so you may rise and move forward once again.


