A Word from Pastor Russ

Beginning a new call in ministry means EVERYTHING is new. When I began my call here at Salem, it meant for me many new faces and personalities, new ways of doing worship, new traditions, new Church Council... the list went on!

Then, after 5 months of learning all these new things, COVID-19 hit and a lot those new things I had just about gotten the hang of.... DISAPPEARED! Suddenly, there were new technologies, new ways to worship, new ways of keeping in touch, new ways of conducting meetings, and more new, new, new.... It really felt like starting all over for me... AND for all of Salem, too!

While new can be nice, *too much* new is really hard and sometimes overwhelming. We've all been finding that out these days. And we've been finding out that it's stressful, too. As M. Scott Peck says in *The Road Less Travelled*:

"Self-discipline is a self-enlarging process. The pain of giving up is the pain of death, but death of the old is birth of the new. The pain of death is the pain of birth, and the pain of birth is the pain of death. For us to develop a new a better idea, concept, theory or understanding means an old idea, concept, theory or understanding must die." *

It's like the old church metaphor of the caterpillar that lives its life on the ground before "dying" in the "tomb" of a cocoon, then emerging in new life as a butterfly. It's also like the death and resurrection of Jesus: for us to develop a better faith, the old faith must die, and it did in Christ.

So, while these are challenging times—and while we're getting weary of these challenging times—remember that these times are the death of a lot of old things in our society and church whose time is up, and remember that their death makes room for new and hopefully better things in society.

Massive change in the world is inevitable; whether it is good change or bad change is up to us. And the church—the church universal and Salem UCC—has the responsibility, the *call*, to make the world's change the very best it can be.

Happy July and Independence Day on July 4th when we celebrate the birth of American independence. Happy belated Juneteenth (on June 19th) which is another celebration and holiday that originated in Texas in 1865 to celebrate the emancipation of slaves in the United States, following President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation in 1862. Juneteenth is also known as Freedom Day, Jubilee Day, Liberation Day and Emancipation Day. This year on Juneteenth, the United Church of Christ started a 4-year campaign to dismantle "structural, systemic, and individual racism."
