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#### **A Word from Pastor Russ**

Ash Wednesday: YUCK.

Don't get me wrong; I actually love Ash Wednesday: the solemnity, reflection, and confession... It's not the day or the service I don't like, it's *preparing* for it. If you're not a pastor and you don't have to make all those ashes to mark people's foreheads, you wouldn't mind it, either.

It's a messy ordeal. First you have to burn the dried palm leaves from last Palm Sunday. We keep a few through the year just for this. But even though they've had months to dry, they're still not easy to burn.

And they smoke. And ash gets on your clothes and you try to brush them off without rubbing them into your clothes (White. For some reason I always manage to wear white when I need to do this! Why?!).

Then you have to pulverize the ashes. They don't conveniently turn to powder when you burn them. No, they fight you every step of the way! And then you add some oil. Not motor oil, but olive oil or anointing oil. And it doesn't mix easily like flower and water, no... None of this is very easy, let me tell you!

And then you have to put it on people without getting it on yourself. I usually wear an alb, the fancy name for a white robe. (White again. I can't seem to get away from white when I'm messing with ashes!)

Ashes are messy. Ash Wednesday is messy. That's why I say "yuck."

But I guess when you think about it, we as people are pretty messy, too. We have messy relationships, messy mistakes, messy struggles... And sin is messy, too. No matter how hard we try, we still, well, mess up. The ashes of Ash Wednesday begin the Christian Season of Lent, and it's their symbolic messiness that Lent is really about: the messiness of God's people, of relationships, and of sin. It's a time to reflect on our humanity, our imperfections, and our need for a God who loves us through it all. We can do that by some sort of Lenten discipline, such as giving up something between now and Easter (like coffee or chocolate), or adding something (like a daily devotion or doing something for someone daily), or even eating a certain thing (like fish) or fasting a certain day each week. In the busyness of our lives, these disciplines remind us to pause and reflect on ourselves, on others, on God, and on our relationships. Lenten disciplines remind us how messy we can be. And I'd like to think that God—who created the palm leaves and the fire that burns them, the oil that's mixed in, as well as the people marked with a cross by them—calls us to remember who we are, and also whose we are in this Journey of Lent.

I look forward to our Lenten journey together. And if I'm wearing white, and you see some ash on me, know that as hard as I try, I, too, can be messy.

## Parsonage (Manor) Update

In January, the Church signed an agreement with Ryan Kimmel to not only manage the Manor, but to repair, replace, or update the Manor to rent it. Areas were painted, patio doors replaced, front and back doors repaired, toilet repaired, etc. Deb Mayhew bought blinds for the Manor to replace any blinds that needed to be replaced. By the end of January, before the work was completed, Ryan already had a sign out front advertising the rental. Also, Buildings and Grounds met with Dave Beaudoin to work on repairing the Manor's driveway, which should be finished by the time this newsletter is printed. Miro cleaned out the remaining "stuff" from the garages so that the house was empty of all church stuff. Ryan found renters, who will be moving in February 25. They have signed a yearlong lease for \$2,500 (minus \$100 commission) per month. A big thanks to Jim Dean and Deb Mayhew who worked on getting the Manor rented.

## **Replatting the Church Property**

With the votes of approval by the Church Council and the Congregation last year, a committee of the Johnson's (Chris and Randy) and the Mayhews (Deb and Kurt) was formed to begin the process of replatting the property in the event of selling the manor and/or the back half of the backyard. The Buildings and Grounds Ministry met on February 24 to determine where the new lines should be drawn. This process does NOT mean we are selling any of the properties, only as a necessary first step that has to be completed before entertaining any vote of selling. Jim Dean has also volunteered to counsel the committee in the replatting process. This replatting ordeal could take anywhere from 6 to 18 months.

## **Parking Lot Update**

Along with the Manor driveway replacement estimate, we received an estimate of what it would take to replace the back 2/3 of the parking lot. It was determined that to do it properly, the top layer of asphalt must be replaced, the underneath layer graded and compacted, and 4 inches of new asphalt put on. Also, the estimate included replacing the south entrance by the dumpster and painting the entire parking lot. The estimate was \$46,500! OUCH!

Buildings and Grounds will keep this estimate, but if anyone else knows of a good company to give us another estimate, we would appreciate it. Obviously, this will have to wait till at least spring and only after a vote of Council and then the Congregation approving this very large expenditure.
