A Word From Pastor Russ

I love snow, always have. There's something absolutely amazing about falling snow, and absolutely wonderful about fallen snow. It changes the world, softens the hard edges, slows us down a bit, and adds magic to the mundane. As I write this, we still have snow on the ground, and a touch of that magic glimmers through my window.

It's finally November of what seems like the longest year ever. With elections this month, the political divisiveness of our country, and the "third wave" of COVID-19, it looks like no matter which way any of this goes—the politics and the pandemic—the first part of 2020 may have been a cake walk compared to the last part of this year.

I feel anxious. I feel stressed. I seem to worry more about whether I remembered my mask and hand sanitizer than what my plans for Thanksgiving are. My heart hurts from not spending time in-person with friends, church members, and colleagues, and I worry Christmas will be more about social isolation than family gatherings around the Christmas tree.

We are all stressed and worn out. We are run down and broken in our own different ways, and social isolation has isolated us from the relationships we crave. We are exhausted from trying to understand one another through masks. ("What?!" must be the most-uttered word of our time, trying to hear someone through a mask and around a plexiglass barrier...). We crave softened edges in these hardened times. We long for magic because our mundane has become such work. We need spiritual snow in our lives!

That's why this month's sermon series is "Peace and Healing." We'll be talking about snow for the soul—stuff that softens the hard edges of this life, slows us down, and maybe—just maybe—adds a little much-needed magic. And if our political or pandemic strife spirals out of control, we'll need to discover how to lean on the One who really is in control. In such times, the Church should be the voice of calm and peace in the world, and we can only do this if we ourselves seek calm and peace in our lives.

In John 14:27 Jesus says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." These words are spiritual snow for our souls, a call to seek peace and healing. My prayer in these coming days is that you will find spiritual snow—peace and healing—as we navigate the rest of 2020. May your edges soften, your life slow down, and your mundane be sprinkled with magic.

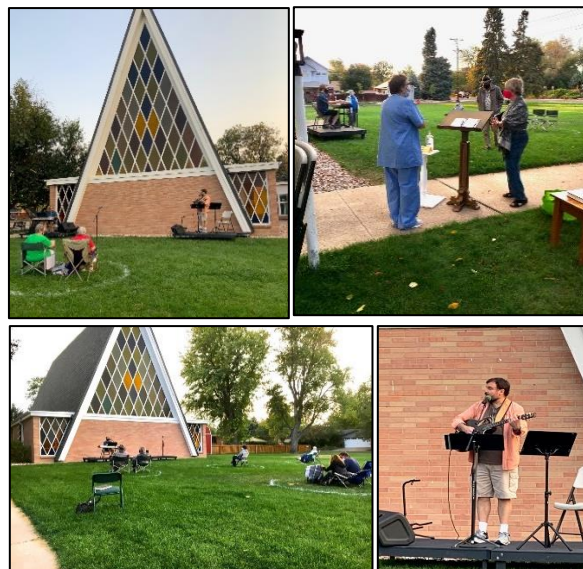
A Note from Deb Mayhew

We will distribute the socks to Archway Housing as well as an organization that serves the homeless. Your checks will be used to buy socks. Socks will be distributed in time for Christmas.

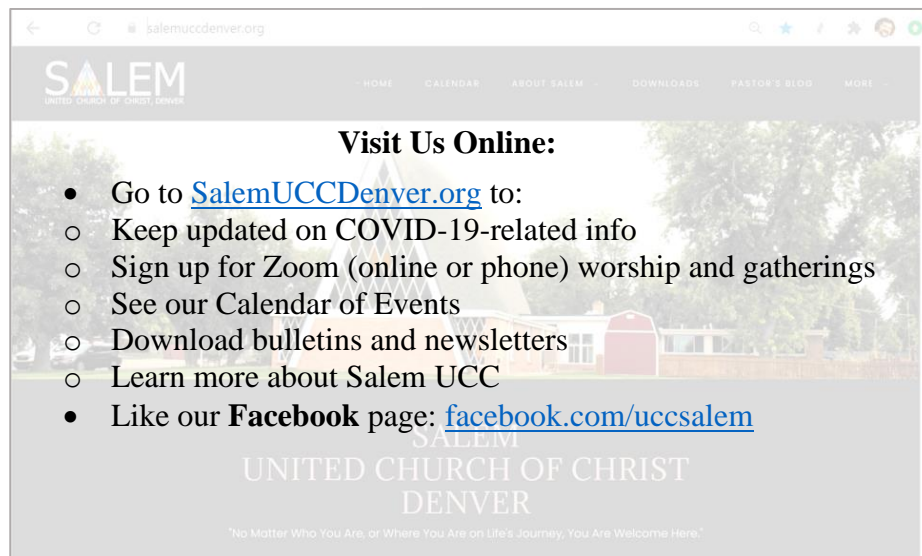
Going forward, contemplate how your stewardship to Salem will look. Salem can remain an active Mission Church despite the pandemic.
