Kilmartin Business Meeting - A Recap

As you can tell from the photos that have been posted, we had a wonderful time of fellowship in Scotland for the 2014 AGM. Thank you to all who attended. To those who were unable to attend, we missed you and hope to see you next year.

I would like to just give a short report here on some business that we took care of this year. We held elections at the AGM and I'm happy to introduce to you the board for the next two years:

President - Mike McAlpin	(two year term)
Vice President - Dale McAlpine	(four year term)
Secretary - Robin McAlpine	(four year term)
Treasurer - Kenneth McAlpine	(two year term)
Member at Large - Finn Stavsnbo Alpin	(four year term)

To maintain stability among the board, we staggered some positions this year so as not to completely change over the board every four years.

As you may recall, I posted on the FB page and in the newsletter some proposed changes to the constitution. The changes made are noted below. Our constitution is in need of some major work and we will be going forward with other changes soon and will submit those to you once we are happy with the document.

Carried as proposed

4.5 Each Officer and Elected Committee Member shall be elected at an Annual General Meeting for a term of up to four years and shall be eligible for re-election. A Committee Member who fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Committee either in electronic format or physical meeting without due cause and notification will be deemed to have resigned from the Committee.

Carried as proposed (with an additional changes)

4.6 The Secretary shall send by email, newsletter or social networking to every Member of the Society a statement showing the vacancies for Officers and Elected Committee Members which at that time can be foreseen as bound to be available for filling at the next Annual General Meeting at least thirty days before the AGM.

Carried as proposed

4.7 To be valid, a nomination shall be received by the Secretary prior to the Annual General Meeting

No changes

4.8 If the number of candidates for any appointment necessitates a vote, a voting paper showing the names of the candidates and the proposer and seconder of each shall be sent to every Member of the Society with the notice of the Annual General Meeting.

Carried as written below

4.9 Every Member of the Society will have one vote. Voting may be either by post, electronic format or in person at the AGM. All votes will be counted at the AGM.

We were very fortunate to have Dr. Durie address our group on the process of becoming a Clan and choosing a Chief. Dr, Durie spoke and answered questions for about one hour; the following is a recap of his talk.

A Clan requires two things, that is to be from the Highlands, and to have a Chief. The process is in part governed by the Lord Lyon, nd in part governed by the Clan or Family. Lyon will grant the undifferenced

arms to the senior line of the Clan or Family. Lyon will recognize someone as Chief of Name and Arms with the right evidence, e.g.

Lineage

Decision of the Clan or Family

Lyon will not pronounce on whether a Name is a Clan or a Family, but will recognize such.

The usual way to choose a Chief is that the Chief's heir inherits, or a lineal or collateral descendant of the last Chief is found. Alternatively, identify a descendant of the most senior line from a known ancestor.

But what if there isn't a Chief? Or what if the line is mostly mythical and can't be proven?

The family must decide which line is the Chiefly line.

The must appoint a Council that would ultimately comprise the Derbhfine.

A Sennachie must be appointed to oversee the process, the Sennachie would marshall information on Pedigrees, Histories, DNA, Receive objections (if any), and report regularly to the Derbhfine, and the family.

Likely "Representers" must be invited to have their pedigrees drawn up or to present existing pedigrees. Lord Lyon operates a judicial court, therefore so must Clan MacAlpine. A pedigree with proofs must be presented, along with &-67 +FF +terminal SNP's testing.

Not acceptable "I saw it in a book that says...", "The family story is..." "There's a tree on Ancestry (etc.) which..."

A family meeting (Derbhfine) must be held where an interim Commander is chosen.

The Family meeting attendees must discuss all pedigrees, and allow time for objections (perhaps five+ years)

Once a Chief is accepted, he may apply to the Lyon Court for the undifferenced arms of the family.

Frank McAlpine "Mac" Toole

Funeral service for Dr. Frank McAlpine "Mac" Toole, 99, of Talladega, North Carolina was held Monday June 2, 2014, at the Presbyterian Church. Burial was in Oak Hill Cemetery. Dr. Toole passed away Friday May 30, 2014, at his home. Born November 27,1914 in Baltimore Maryland, Dr. Toole grew up in Asheville and Talladega, North Carolina, attending school in both cities. He was a 1932 graduate of Talladega High School, a 1936 graduate of Davidson College of North Carolina, where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, and a 1940 graduate of Emory University School of Dentistry. After two years of practicing dentistry in Birmingham, Dr. Toole spent the next 43 years practicing dentistry in Talladega. During that time he also served his country as a major with the Army Dental Corps. He retired from the practice of dentistry on July 1,1985. Dr. Toole was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Talladega, where he served several terms as a Deacon, a term as a Ruling Elder and as clerk of session. Dr. Toole also was a faithful member of the church choir. He was preceded in death by his parents, Dr. Arthur Fulkerson Toole and Kate McAlpine Toole, his first wife, Florence Smith Toole and son, Frank McAlpine Toole Jr. He is survived by his wife, Mary Alice Toole; children, Howard Vandiver Toole, Stephen Clarke Toole, John Stephen Clarke Toole, John Steven Fleming and Margaret Lindsey Fleming; brother, Dr. Arthur F.
