So many historical moments were documented by the number of men in attendance or signatures of men to make the "thing" happen? Your chance to strengthen the Name of MacAlpin(e) as a formidable and true family of Scotland is merely a touch of your fingertip or ink pen. Much work has been done over the last many years and as you've read through the past newsletters, it's been a lengthy and painstaking process. And now, we need you.

As you may have heard, we have been working for many years to seat a Chief of the name MacAlpine and you all play an important role in this quest.

How? If you're a MacAlpine by marriage, then encourage your husband to be active and register to sign the petition and vote, once we send out the request for action.

Duncan McAlpine Schoolmaster at Laphroaig

If your taste runs to Laphroig Single Malt, with its tastes of smoked paprika, some mango and freshly dug

peat, with a generous taste of bitter smoke, maybe there is a deep seated connection.

Behind the Laphroig Distillery, is the Bleak House, where Schoolmaster Duncan McAlpine held classes at Laphroaig

Duncan was the brother Neil McAlpine of Gaelic Dictionary fame, who also taught school at Kilmeny.

The Homestead Project – McAlpins at Poltalloch Farm

Poltalloch Farm is located about five miles west of Kilmartin around Duntrune CastleThe farm is part of the Old Poltalloch estate, which includes a country house and pavilion dating back to the 18th century. The house, unfortunately, is now in ruins. The farm and the surrounding estate were the principal residence of the MacCallum or Malcolm family from the 16th century until they purchased Duntrune Castle from the Campbells in 1796.

The Poltalloch House, about two and a half miles south and west of Kilmartin is part of the estate. Now in ruins, it is a large Jacobean mansion of two storeys, designed by William Burn in the 1830s. Although it was stripped and unroofed in the 1950s and is now a shell, it remains a testament to the architectural style of the period.

Many MacAlpines lived and worked on the Poltalloch Estate, amongst them was Donald McAlpin. He was born in 1796 at Poltalloch Farm. He was the son of Malcom Hugh McAlpine and Mary Curry. Donald's father, Malcom, was born in Lochgilphead and christened in Kilmartin on June 17, 1753.

Donald married Mary McKellar on January 24, 1817, in Lochgilphead. At that time, Donald was employed at Clachan Farm, which is now known as the Loch Fyne Oyster Bar. Over the years, Donald farmed at various locations, including Achnasellach farm near present-day Lochgilphead, Culintrach farm in Skipness, and Strandour farm.


Donald and Mary had a daughter, Margaret, born in 1817 at Achriah Farm, Kilmorich, Argyll, and a son, Malcom, born in 1834 at Strandour farm. The family lived in Skipness in 1841, where Donald worked as a laborer on the Oragaig farm.

After their time in Skipness, Donald and Mary embarked on a new journey. They emigrated to Canada, appearing on the 1851 census in Southwold Township, Ontario.

Savannah Scottish Games – May 4th, 2024

As we started to kick off the spring season with games around the southeast, we added a new venue to expand our reach and exposure. This year we hosted a tent in Savannah, the oldest and second largest city in the state of Georgia. What a wonderful experience! If you have never visited Savannah before, you should put it on your list! It is unique, and the city has done an excellent job of preserving the history and beauty of pre-Colonial days with town squares, parks, Spanish moss, carriage rides etc. Side note: The MacAlpine name is famous in the city, as most of the bricks and decorative wrought iron works you see were manufactured by a famous MacAlpine! (Henry McAlpin 1777-1851).

The Highland Games in Savannah are rapidly growing and has *doubled* their attendance from last year. I can see why. The venue for the games is on the campus of historic Bethesda Academy, founded in 1740. It's difficult to accurately describe this beautiful setting. It is surrounded by majestic oak trees that are hundreds of years old. Their branches extend out in all directions covered with Spanish moss. As you enter the campus, you walk through a brick archway and down the main entrance under an incredible canopy of oak tree branches. Every walkway throughout the campus is like walking through a tunnel with the majestic trees providing their shade. The games are in an open area in the middle of a large circle pathway also surrounded by trees, and the clan tents are set up under the canopy. As you walk further down the pathways to the entertainment, food, and vendor sections, you walk through a hedge row to the stage where the highland dancers compete. The stage is constructed on the bank of the historic Moon River, made famous by the song sung by Audry Hepburn in the movie "Breakfast at Tiffany's." Everywhere you turn, you will find yourself saying "OMG, I can't believe this place!"

Our tent was hosted by Charles McAlpine with wife Sheryl McAlpine and daughter Keelin McAlpine. We were also joined by Michael Crooms who traveled up from Tallahassee FI. We were in an awesome spot right next to the border collie exhibition and the pipe band competition. Directly in front of us was the heavy athletics, and tug of war (a crowd favorite). We could see it all from both sides of our site! Our tent was configured so you could walk through and see everything. It was well decorated and really looked great. We received a lot of compliments from the game's administrators on the professional and classy presentation. (Thank you, Michael McAlpin, for sending me the starter kit.)

As we continue to grow and expand our exposure over on the southeastern US coast, I am proud to see us include the great cities of Savannah and Charleston. This area has a very rich Scottish heritage with many of its founders originating from Scotland (and Ireland). Celtic pride is strong in the area as evidenced by Savannah's famous St. Patrick's Day celebration, and rapidly expanding Scottish Games and festival immediately after. It is an incredible event to put on your bucket list next year! I hope to see you there!



Their music is great.




Bressuire Highland Games (France) – 2024


