The latest in the five elements series, limited to 600 units. Crystal carafe made by the prestigious DAUM glassworks. Century-old eaux-de-vie made from pre-phylloxera Colombard grapes. A Cognac of exceptional complexity, the most expensive in the world in 1981.

Haute Couture for Cognac:

A British gentleman, Anthony Hardy, founded Hardy cognac in 1863. Five generations later, the house of Hardy is still recognized for its premium quality cognacs and a smooth, lightly-oaked taste.

Technical information:

ABV: 40%

Grape varieties: primarily Colombard

Production: Selection of Grande Champagne eaux-de-vie from pre-phylloxera Colombard vines.

Aging: Century-old eaux-de-vie among the rarest in our Paradis (cellar holding our oldest eaux-de-vie). An exceptionally vibrant and aromatic Cognac despite its advanced age.

- ◆ Nose: chocolate, coffee
- ◆ Palate: soft, rounded and velvety, cinnamon
- ◆ Finish: hugely powerful aromas, cigar box, nutmeg
