Safety Corner- Mike F

Hello everyone! I hope everyone is doing well and getting some riding in! I became an MSF instructor because I was tired of reading local articles of riders being killed. I use that position now to try and reach those new (and some experienced) riders. I am now going to use this position as Safety Officer to do the same thing within our HOG chapter. If my words save one person, I have done my job. With that being said, this article will be about what I believe, some of the most important aspects of riding a motorcycle.

We all hear the old saying, "Ride like you are invisible". I would like to challenge this, instead of 'Ride like your invisible' how about 'Make yourself more visible'. There are many things you can do to accomplish this.

Many cagers suffer what is called Inattentional blindness, be aware of it. This means, they do not see what their eyes are not trained to see. People that do not ride, they can look right at a motorcycle and never see it. Their brains are trained to see other cars, not motorcycles - it is not intentional. An example of this is, maybe you bought a particular make/model of a car, prior to buying it, you only seen a few, as soon as you buy that make and model, you see them everywhere. Think back to before you rode, how many motorcycles on the road did you see? How many do you see now? I bet it is MUCH more.

When riding, think of your lane position. Choose a lane position that makes you more visible. This lane position can change depending on your surroundings. Other things are staying out of blind spots, motorcycle lighting, reflective and/or hi-vis gear, how close you are and lane position when sitting behind a vehicle at an intersection. You want to avoid a lane position that could cause you to blend into your surroundings. Ask yourself what other things you can do to make yourself more visible.

Situational awareness. SEE everything! Know your surroundings 360 degrees around you ALL the time, what is behind you is just as important as what is in front of you. How far ahead do you look? Have always at least one escape path. Intersections are one of the most dangerous places for motorcycles. When parked at a traffic light, where are you? Are you right on the bumper of the car in front of you sitting in the middle of the lane, transmission in neutral with the clutch out? If a vehicle approaches and can't stop, what are you going to do? When the light turns green, take a second and look to make sure traffic stops before proceeding, don't just look at the first car, the second or third one may be the problem. Never assume that a cager sees you, never assume a vehicle is going to stop. Coming down Sunshine did you see the car approaching the stop sign at the intersection ahead of you? What can you do to prepare and minimize your risk if that vehicle decides to proceed?

Read traffic, watch for drivers that are driving erratically, speeding, abrupt lane changes, etc. watch for inattentive drivers on their phones, eating, etc. Ask yourself, where is the safest place to be? Many of us would prefer to be ahead of these types of

drivers, but is that really the safest?

The last thing I am going to talk about is road rage. This may not be popular for some but, if you suffer from this, maybe you should reevaluate your decision to ride a motorcycle or at least learn to control if before you throw a leg over. Your only protection is the gear you may (or may not) have on. The other is protected by cocoon with air bags that weighs at minimum, 3-4 times more than you. You will never win a road rage incident with a car. If you allow that person to make you angry, THEY WIN! Let it go, let them go and ENJOY YOUR RIDE! I personally chose to NEVER allow someone to have that much control over me.

These are just a few of the things you can do to make yourself safer and minimize your risk while riding. Many of these are things you can practice driving in a cage as well. I would challenge everyone to start practicing these ideas, if you are not doing so now, on the bike, and in your cage. If you do that, it will start to become natural.

Chaplain's Meditations - Gregg and Jeanne

Four-Dimensional Love

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails.

1 Corinthians 13:4-8

A four-year-old was asked the question: "What does love mean?" The answer was both amusing and profound; "Love is when your puppy licks your face, even after you left him alone all day." There is a tendency to measure love by the outward response received. The word "love" has lost much of its power to convey something special. Consider these statements: "I love you. I love my dog. I love to eat. I love my Harley. I love to ride. Let's make love. I love God." We use the same word to describe how we feel about each of those statements. Our meaning in each case is guite different.

The Apostle Paul prayed that his readers would "grasp how wide and long and high and deep is Christ's love" (Ephesians 3:18). The word "grasp" literally means to experience love, not just have a mental concept of love. Paul described four dimensions of God's love that he wanted people to experience.

Consider the width of God's love. The width of God's love is the most obvious thing that distinguishes His love from human love. We love certain people but not others. We love certain types of people, but not others. The Bible teaches that there are no substandard people, nations, or tribes. "For God so loves the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). God loves everybody! Think about the person you most dislike. Now think about this: God loves that person. God's love is all inclusive.

Consider the length of God's love. The most likely meaning is a reference to time. God's love is from everlasting to everlasting. It isn't just available on Sundays. His love is not inconvenienced or bothered by disruptions. God's love is available all the time.

Consider the height of God's love. Height refers to measurement. It also refers to "a high standard" or "quality." The quality of God's love surpasses anything we have ever known or experienced. Quality is determined by comparison. Which is a better bike? Harley or Honda? Your decision is determined by quality and preference. God's love is of such quality that it will never measure you by comparison to someone else.

Consider the depth of God's love. This love describes the depths of the sea, or the depths of a miry pit. It is also used in the parable of the seed. The seed that lands on rocky soil and springs up quickly dies, because there is no depth to the soil. It looks good, but there's nothing to it. God's love is real. Depth not only refers to the fact that it's authentic, but that God's love reaches into the depth of our deepest needs.

Width, length, height, and depth describes a box. How big is your box of God's love? We limit God's love by the size of our box. God's love cannot be contained by your thought and understanding of Him. He is much bigger than that. God loves you!

Prayer

Father God, thank you that your love is unconditional, immeasurable and eternal. That it never runs out nor can it be any greater than it is for me right now. Holy Spirit, help me to share the love that has been so freely given to me with others who surround my life. I ask this in the name of Jesus; the One who embodies perfect love. Amen.
