Safety Corner- Mike F

The riding season is just about here! Temperatures are going to start warming and we should be able to start to get plenty of riding in! Before the riding season gets started I am going to talk a little about two more safety topics.

Training and classes:

OTC has opened the registration for the BRC class. This is a beginner's class and is geared towards riders who have never ridden a motorcycle before. This is a two-day course. Classes are \$275 and a motorcycle is provided. You cannot ride your own motorcycle. This is the only course you can take (upon completion) that will grant you a waiver to get the motorcycle endorsement on your license. Classes fill up VERY fast! To register visit: https://academics.otc.edu/shortterm/motorcycle/

Share the Road is a course that is offered by the Springfield Police Department and is taught by several of the Springfield Moto Officers. This is a one-day class and is FREE!!!!! This is not a beginner's course and is a very challenging class but a lot of fun. Registration is now open, and dates are May 17th, June 14th, September 6th, and October 11th. Participants must have a valid endorsement and must show current registration and insurance. To register visit: https://www.springfieldmo.gov/5289/Share-The-Road-Motorcycle-Course

Our own Wil Wheelock is also conducting ART (Advanced Motorcycle Techniques). This is FREE to all HOG members and will give you the knowledge and practice in handling your motorcycle at low speeds. Upon completion, you can also earn a really cool patch! First scheduled time is March 9th and will be held at TMRHD. I have personally trained with Wil and he is VERY knowledgeable and has a lot of good information on techniques for slow speed maneuvers. For more information reach out to Wil.

Remember, continue to practice these techniques once you learn them. These are diminishing skills, if you do not practice them, you will lose them and some of these skills can be life saving.

Gear: I will not say anything to anyone regarding the lack of gear, I believe it is a personal choice as to whether you wear it or not but here are just a few things to think about...

Helmets: Since the change in the motorcycle helmet law in 2020, motorcycle fatalities in Missouri have risen by over 40%. Half helmets offer very little protection. Helmets can get hot in the summer but there are other ways to keep cool by using a cooling towel around your neck or a cooling vest. The helmet law in Missouri does require any operator or passenger under 26 or anyone riding on an instruction permit is still required to wear a helmet.

Boots: Will give your ankles much needed support in the event of an accident or a drop. Broken ankles are a very common injury among motorcycle riders.

Jeans offer less than one second of protection on the pavement. I have personally seen students in our MSF course burn through a pair of jeans and get some nasty road rash going less than 20 MPH. Leathers offer a great level of protection but can get hot in the summer. They also make mesh shirts, pants, and jackets that allow air to flow through and are abrasion resistant for those warmer summer months.

Chaplain's Meditations - Gregg and Jeanne

Keep It Simple

"Do not get any gold or silver or copper to take with you in your belts—no bag for the journey or extra shirt or sandals or a staff, for the worker is worth his keep."

(Matthew 10:9-10 NIV)

We have all heard the saying and probably have said it often — "Keep it simple, stupid!" In a complicated, confusing, chaotic world we live in, we find simplicity in hitting the starter button and cranking our bike's engine; listening to the sound of those pipes; riding out of our driveway; accelerating down the road; feeling the breeze in our face; headed to nowhere in particular. Our ride becomes a welcome relief from the day-by-day stresses that we all face. But then again, even the ride can sometimes create unexpected complications and stress. So, my question is, how can I "keep it simple" in my life? Jesus provided His followers an answer in their travels in the above quoted verse.

We are to live wisely. To do so, emphasizes the importance of intentionality in our actions and decisions. It's about aligning life with God's will and making purposeful choices. Jesus provided His disciples with a few simple, uncomplicated approaches for living as Christians in a challenge-filled world in Matthew 10.

Jesus makes His instructions clear regarding dependence and provision. In a very complicated and at times confusing world of today, there is a need to often reexamine our own spiritual journey. As a biker, with limited luggage space, who has traveled cross-country a number of times, there are certain things I learned about packing and traveling light (or keeping it simple) that can be translated into our spiritual journey. Here are four principles to travel light on our spiritual journey.

- (1) Simplicity. Travel light, focusing on what is essential and avoiding cumbersome, unnecessary burdens. Cast ALL your cares on Jesus. (1Peter 5:7) This will allow you to be more effective and responsive to God's plan for your life.
- (2) Trust. Rely in God's provision and trust in His care, knowing that He will provide for your needs as you step out in faith. (Psalm 55:22)
- (3) Community. Build supportive relationships and be open to both receiving and giving hospitality. Foster a sense of community and mutual support. The biker culture offers that and so does a church family. (Acts 4:32)
- (4) Contentment. Embrace contentment and gratitude for God's provision. Nurture a spirit of generosity and thankfulness. (Philippians 4:6)

Live wisely and accelerate with intentionality. Navigate life with a sense of purpose, trust, and community with Jesus. Make the most of every God-given opportunity and make a positive impact with those surrounding your life. "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is." (Eph. 5:15-17 NIV)
