Safety Corner- Mike F

Spring and riding season are here! With the temperatures starting to warm up make sure you check your tires for the correct air pressure, for those that do not ride a bunch, check the dates on your tires, tires have a shelf life! It is recommended to replace them after 5 years of the date of manufacture. While you are at it, make sure all the other critical components/controls are functioning correctly and adjusted properly, check all fluids and make sure they are topped off or if they need servicing.

With spring comes storms, if you are out on a ride make sure you are prepared for a chance of one of those surprise pop up storms Missouri is so famous for, even with the warmer temperatures, the wet clothes and wind can cause your core temperature to drop. With temperatures starting to climb, make sure you are also staying hydrated! Don't forget about our beloved Ozarks critters, now is the time for them to start climbing out of their hiding places so be on the lookout for these guys too! A little turtle can cause a bad day!

More group rides! This is a GREAT way to get to know some of the other HOG members, especially on the longer, overnight trips. Please be familiar with HOG group riding practices and hand signals. If you are not familiar with them, please review them, they are available in the Chapter Handbook beginning on page 12. This can be downloaded from the Ozark Mountain Hog Chapter website under the 'MORE' tab 'Chapter Documents'. Scroll to the bottom and it will be under the heading 'H.O.G. Documents'

Shortcuts

"...God did not lead them along the main road that runs through Philistine territory, even though that was the shortest route to the Promised Land. ... So God led them in a roundabout way through the wilderness toward the Red Sea. Thus the Israelites left Egypt like an army ready for battle. (Exodus 13:17-18 NLT)

Shortcuts! Let's be honest about them. Unless we are on a joy ride, we are almost always looking for shortcuts. However, shortcuts are not always the best route to take in life's journey. It would take took the children of Israel 40 years to reach God's "Promised Land," when in actuality, a more direct route would have taken them only 8 days.
