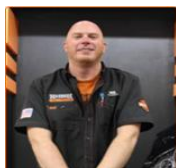

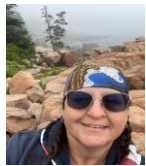

OUR CONNECTION BETWEEN PHYSICAL AND DIVINE ACTIONS

"In prayer there is a connection between what God does and what you do. You can't get forgiveness from God, for instance, without also forgiving others. If you refuse to do your part, you cut yourself off from God's part."

(Matthew 6:14-15 MSG)

There is a connection between what God does and what you do. This means that our actions, especially in the realm of forgiveness, are intertwined with God's actions. PRAYER IS NOT JUST ABOUT ASKING GOD FOR THINGS BUT ALSO ABOUT ALIGNING OUR BEHAVIOR WITH HIS WILL. Prayer is more than just a conversation with God. Prayer is to be an extension of our lifestyle. Elsewhere in Scripture we are instructed to *"pray continually"* (1 Thessalonians 5:17). It's a simple two-word directive. I think we tend to focus on the first word without giving enough thought to the second word, "continually."

Using Aretha Franklin's iconic 1967 hit song spelling out of the word "R-E-S-P-E-C-T" as an acrostic, when we pray continually, we...

- **R**ecognize the sovereignty of God. Every life has value and purpose, even before we are born.
- **E**mbrace responsibility. This means taking responsibility for our actions and decisions, ensuring they align with God's will and purpose. Every choice has a consequence. Do the right thing for the right reason.
- **S**erve others. Jesus is our ultimate example of serving others. He gave up his "rights" as the Son of God that you might live. His life is the true example of what the sanctity of life means.
- **P**ray continually. I need not to say more. Continual prayer keeps us connected to God.
- **E**ngage in community. Be part of a faith community. Life is meant to be done together.
- **C**ultivate gratitude. Gratitude (being thankful) changes attitude!
- **T**rust in God's plan. Life is unpredictable, but trusting in God's plan gives us peace and assurance. He is in control and has a purpose for everything we experience.

What we do physically impacts the spiritual. What we do spiritually impacts the physical. Both the physical and the spiritual are connected. We tend to separate the two. But Jesus, as Son of Man (physical) and as Son of God (Divine), connects our physical world to the heavenly world. *"Dear friend, I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you, even as your soul is getting along well."* (3 John 1:2)
