Chaplain's Meditations - Gregg and Jeanne

WHERE YOU LOOK YOU WILL GO

"Let your eyes look straight ahead; fix your gaze directly before you. Give careful thought to the paths for your feet and be steadfast in all your ways. Do not turn to the right or the left; keep your foot from evil." (Proverbs 4:25-27 NIV)

What are you looking at? One simple important rule in motorcycle riding is that where you are looking your bike will take you. It's probably one of the first lessons learned when riding on two wheels; be it on a bicycle as a child, or now, when riding our Harley's. This rule never fails. In fact, the Book of Proverbs offer us a lot of good instruction on how to live a good and full life.

Here are some valuable lessons we can draw from these three verses:

- 1. **Focus and Determination**: The instruction to "let your eyes look straight ahead" encourages us to maintain focus on our goals and not be easily distracted. Whether it's personal growth, a project, or a relationship, staying focused helps us achieve better outcomes.
- 2. **Thoughtful Decision-Making**: The verse advises us to "give careful thought to the paths for your feet." This reminds us to consider our choices wisely. Reflecting on the consequences of our actions can lead to better decisions.
- 3. **Steadfastness**: Being "steadfast in all your ways" implies consistency and commitment. It encourages us to remain faithful to our principles, even when faced with challenges or temptations.
- Avoiding Evil: The final part of the verse advises us not to turn to the right or left, keeping our feet from evil. This emphasizes the importance of integrity, honesty, and avoiding harmful paths.

In your life's journey, who and what are you focusing your eyes on? Your answer to that question determines your life's direction. Jesus said, "seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matthew 6:33) Prioritizing God's kingdom and righteousness ensure that your choices align with His will. The wisdom of Proverbs 4:25-27, encourages us to stay focused, think critically (considering your choices), and avoid straying from the right path. It's a powerful reminder to keep our eyes on what truly matters, Jesus, "the author and finisher of our faith." (Hebrews 11:2)
