Greetings fellow Riders, Passengers, and Enthusiasts! We have made it to the end of the winter riding season, and we are ready, willing, and anxious to start a new Spring riding season. We have lots of events planned, so stay tuned to the weekly E-Blasts and all our chapter social media websites for the latest news. I think 2024 is going to be a banner year for our HOG chapter! And speaking of banners, be sure to check out the Million Mile Challenge banner hanging in our HOG room!

There has been some confusion over HOG points and Renegade dealership points. HOG points are awarded for participating in HOG activities and volunteering for HOG events. Renegade dealership points are awarded for volunteering for dealership activities. The Renegade points are converted to CASH in the dealership. HOG points are recorded in your orange Chapter Challenge books (and don't have any CASH value). To make things easier, we have come up with a system so that everyone knows what you are signing up for. If the signup sheet is WHITE, then the activity or event is a Chapter Event, and you will earn points for your Chapter Challenge Book. If the signup sheet is PINK, you will earn Renegade Dealership points for that activity. Debbie V. is our contact for all Renegade Dealership activities, and she will manage the pink signin sheets. The white HOG signup sheets will be managed by the respective department, i.e. LOH, Activities, Food Team, Road Captains, etc.

We also have a new convenient way to record your monthly mileage. You can now simply take a picture of your odometer and email the picture along with your name (and passenger name if putting in miles), HOG national number, and which bike (type and year) the odometer belongs to <u>HOG@Renegade-HD.com</u>. If you have multiple motorcycles, please send each bike mileage reading in a separate email. Your mileage will be updated during normal business hours and should show up in your RIDE 365 app within 3-5 days. This will save you time and will make it convenient to do a monthly mileage check-in. This email goes directly to Debbie V. at the dealership.

Please extend a heart-felt THANK YOU to all the officers in our chapter. They contribute countless hours of volunteer time to ensure that our HOG chapter will be the best that it can be. And thank each other for being a member of our riding community.

Chaplain's Meditations - Gregg and Jeanne

The Promise of the Resurrection: An Eternal Spring

Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and righteousness looks down from heaven. The Lord will indeed give what is good, and our land will yield its harvest. Righteousness goes before him and prepares the way for his steps.

Psalm 85:11-13

Springtime! More riding opportunities! Spring reveals the glory of God's creation in ways that Winter, Summer, and Fall do not. If we look at springtime with biblical eyes, we see resurrection. During Spring, God brings new life to his creation. Trees get their leaves back, flowers bloom, birds hatch, and animals come out of hibernation. Martin Luther once said, "Our Lord has written the

promise of the resurrection, not in books alone, but in every leaf in springtime." The dawning of Spring is a truly marvelous thing to observe. Marvelous because it is stunningly beautiful. Marvelous because springtime teaches us an important theological truth. According to Psalm 19 and Romans 1, everything in creation teaches us something about the Creator. God ordained the seasons to reveal to us His overall plan for humanity.

Springtime shows us that God delights to make things new. Winter does not last forever. Every year, God reminds us through His creation that He can bring dead things to life. Springtime points us to the Resurrection, and the Resurrection is the promise of the Gospel.

The Gospel teaches us that we are born dead in our sins, but can be made alive spiritually by grace through faith in Jesus (Eph. 2:1-8). It teaches us that our new spiritual life will one day be accompanied by a new physical life.

Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15:51-53, "Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality."

Do you see the promise? *"We shall all be changed."* Our bodies will be made new. Jesus *"will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body"* (Phil. 3:21). *"When Jesus appears, we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is"* (1 Jn. 3:2).

After the Winter of this life, an eternal Spring will come for all who are hoping in Jesus Christ. Darkness will fade, light will shine. Death will die, life will never end. Pain will cease, pleasures forevermore will be ours (Ps. 16:11). Jesus' resurrection was the inauguration of this great, cosmic Spring that will come (1 Cor. 15:20, 23). When he returns to the earth, he will return to make it new (Rev. 21:1-5). Those who love him will live in a new world with God. A world with no more sin or suffering. A world with no more sad things. This eternal Spring is a promise for those who *"confess with their mouths that Jesus is Lord and believe in their hearts that God raised him from the dead"* (Rom. 10:9). The promise of the Resurrection is a new body and a new world for those who put their hope and trust in Jesus. Springtime shouts of the glory of this newness. Do you see it?

Summer and the Gang

The week after my two-hour lunch with Brent I went on my longest solo ride. I have friends in St. Louis, so I rode to St Louis. From there, I rode to Cincinnati. It was not a straight shot though, thanks to Brent. I left Indianapolis to go to Mentone, Indiana for the 50 Rides. I made it to Cincinnati after twelve and a half hours and 636 miles of wind therapy.

The next morning, I left the hotel early and rode three hours east to get Ohio's 50 Rides location the Triple Nickel. I took the picture and Face Timed my brother to share my adventure with him. I made a dealership check-in or two on my way back to the hotel in Cincinnati.

I rested for about an hour before heading to Great American Ballpark to see the St Louis Cardinals play the Cincinnati Reds. Unexpected surprise was the motorcycle parking for the game. After parking I walked out of the "garage" made a couple of right hand turns and quickly figured out that I was parked under the right field stands. Parking was only \$20 and my ticket was \$80 (right behind home plate). The Cardinals lost by one run in the 10th inning but it was a great game and a great ballpark.

The next morning, I rode back to St. Louis. I made several stops to get dealership check-ins. Fun Fact: I learned that my skin burns more easily now since the heart attack (due to medications). By the time I made it back to St. Louis, I was as red as a cooked lobster.

My total milage for the trip was just over 2000 miles. I was extremely burnt, but I was all smiles. End of May and I now have the 50 Rides for three state, one 10 for '23 and 14 dealership check-in stops.

Summer officially starts in June. I had a work-related convention in Orlando that kept me away from my bike. After I returned from Florida, I went to the Mid-America HOG Rally with the gang. I had a great time. I was able to get to know

more of the chapter members. It was fun to ride some of the roads and routes I used to ride when I lived in St. Louis. It was different this time because I was part of a group.

Since July 4th was on a Tuesday, I took Monday the 3rd off. I left early and rode to the Oklahoma coin stop. I was headed from Oklahoma toward Ft. Smith when it went from sunshine to thunderstorm within a mile. I looked at the radar and sure enough there was nothing and suddenly there was a red cell of rain right over me. Forty-five minutes later I was back on the road. Very wet, but on the road. The storm hit so quick I was soaking wet before I could get my rain gear out, much less put on.

Next up, ride the Pigs Trail, Arkansas 23 and get my picture at the sign. This would complete the Arkansas 50 Rides. By the end of the day, I have completed the H-D App challenge for July and received the digital coin in addition to the two coin stops for OK & AR.

Three more months, more dealership check-ins, more challenges completed and more 50 Rides checked off.
