Safety Corner- Dwain

Greeting brothers & sisters. Well, looks like spring is at the back door and summer is getting ready to come in the front. We have a lot of cross-country rides coming up till this fall. Hope everyone takes the opportunity to jump on board with one or more of them. Always be thinking of necessities to pack. Rechargeable flashlight, jump start charger, first aid kit, rain gear, rechargeable air pump, Ziploc baggies, zip ties, assortment of tools, couple of trash bags, and of course plenty of dry clothes. There are two more very important things to pack as well. 1) A couple bottles of water or enhanced water (Gatorade, etc.) and 2) Sunscreen. Water is very important as we all know to keep us hydrated. A couple of late warning signs for being dehydrated is your urine will be a dark yellow in color and another is if you're out in the heat and you are getting cold chills. Sunscreen is also very important as, so we don't get sunburned. A good-looking tan is one thing, but when you get a sunburn on top of it then that's no fun. If you do get a sunburn the best thing to do is take a very hot shower, the hottest that you can stand, the heat from the water will set the burn. You will still have the sunburn, but it won't feel nearly as painful. Do NOT rub oils or lotion on the burn. It's like a frozen tator tot, it's already cooked but when you put it into the fryer it just burns it more. Remember, you only have three layers of skin and burns are 1st degree (redness in color), 2nd degree (severe redness with blisters), and 3rd degree (black charcoaled). Our skin is a living organ for our bodies, so let's save our skin. Enjoy all the trips along with all the other rides and events this summer but be safe about it. A September to Remember
