TOM SMITH AND THE MAGIC HOLD DOWNS ...

Tom Smith is one of our most safety conscious members, and we are lucky for that. One of the safety items that Tom especially likes is the fork-shaped hold downs we use for our planes. They are soldered together copper piping, some "L's" and a "T". To protect the airplane, the copper piping is covered with insulating material. There's a long stretch of these hold downs in the pit area for anyone who wants to use them. The Club maintains them. While they seemed strange in the beginning, they are actually very comfortable to work. And they do add a significant safety edge, especially when you're tuning up your plane.

But Tom, never satisfied, is always finding a way to upgrade them. The insulating material fit poorly over the pipe and, as a result, deteriorated rapidly. In his experiments, Tom found that the best covering for the pipe is the "fun noodles" which people use in swimming pools. The material fits snugly over the piping and, when cut to proper length, makes a very attractive device. The multi-colored hold downs were very refreshing after those dark and gloomy days. Tom plans to write an article on the hold downs for submission to one of the RC modeling magazines.
