The first was a 60-inch wingspan Goldberg Bucker Jungmeister Bipe powered by an OS 160 2-cycle engine. Enough power, Tom? His second beauty was a Goldberg Extra powered with a Webra 120 2-cycle engine.

Bob Walker brought in a very pretty Great Planes Ultrasport 40 Plus. It's powered with an OS FX 46.

Under contract to Tom Obringer, Jim Snyder built a Balsa USA giant 1913 Taube. (That means the dove, of course. That's almost like a goose). It will have an OS 91 4-stroke. The plane is only completed in the "bones". The hand-off was made to Tom, who will complete the covering, installation of hardware, and final tuning.
