LITHIUM BATTERIES...

There has been some concern recently regarding the safe use of lithium batteries. Dave Brown, President of AMA, highlighted some of the issues in an editorial in the June issue of Model Aviation and Bob Walker got us a copy of some precautions recommended by the AMA Safety Committee. The principal issue with high energy density batteries is the risk of fire. This can happen as result of improper charging, crash damage or shorting the batteries. A lithium battery fire is very hot and burns almost explosively. The following is abstracted from the AMA's Safety Committee Announcement:

- 1. Store and charge in a fireproof container.
- 2. Never leave the charging process unattended.

- 3. Never attempt to charge a cell with physical damage.
- 4. Never use chargers designed for Nickel Cadmium batteries.
- 5. If batteries show any sign of swelling, discontinue charging and remove them to a safe place outside.
- 6. Never plug in a battery and leave it to charge unattended overnight.

This is serious stuff. Let's treat it that way.
