President, Steve Snyder, opened the meeting of Apr 8 at 7:00PM at the Churchville Rec Center. The minutes are as follows:


1. Jim Snyder reported that the field trip to the Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center was very successful... a good show and a good time for all who participated.

We had some nice participation in our show and tell at the April meeting. Tim Getz brought in a very nice looking Sig Extra 300 ARF. It has about a 76 inch wingspan and is powered with a Fox 2.4 engine...mint condition, we'll be looking for it at the field soon.

CAPTAIN JOHN KIRK, A WORLD WAR II FLYING ACE, PASSED AWAY...

John Kirk, a member of the Radio Control Modelers of Baltimore (RCMB) just passed away. John was a highly decorated pilot of WWII. I first met John at RCMB's flea market/fun fly in September 2000. What a pleasure it was to talk with him. He was the real McCoy, a flying ace with six kills to his credit, including the first German jet fighter, a Messerschmidt ME262.

He was sent to Duxford, England as part of the 78th Fighter Group of the 8th Air Force. This is where the "Brits" fought the Battle of Britain off a simple grass runway. John flew escort to the B-17 Flying Fortresses which were bombing Germany. He flew 12 missions as a P47 Thunderbolt pilot. He was later assigned a P51D Mustang and flew an additional 60 missions.

John was shot down twice and each time was able to reach safety through the help of the underground resistance. John received many awards for his service, including the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Silver Star, the Purple Heart, and the Air Medal with 17 Oak Leaf Clusters.

John was in modeling all his life. He was very active in RCMB and was admired by all its members. They honored him by naming their site after him, Kirk Field. As an additional tribute they installed a weather vane using the profile and markings of his old P51 Mustang.

John was an affable person. One of the things he took pride in telling me was that he was the real "Captain Kirk". That pretender on Star-Trek wasn't even around when he made his mark.

All those black and white photos of WWII don't seem so unreal or far away when you have a

**The Carolinas Aviation Museum
Charlotte, NC**

THE CAROLINAS AVIATION MUSEUM....

Proving that we will spare no expense in bringing you the highest quality Newsletter, we traveled to North Carolina to get you this story. Actually, we were going to Disney World and stopped near the Charlotte/Douglas International Airport in Charlotte, NC. We noticed in our brochures that the Carolinas Aviation Museum was located on an older portion of the air field.

We had to investigate. The organization was founded in 1992 as the Carolinas Historic Aviation Commission (CHAC). They are a non-profit

organization and supported solely by membership dues, fund raisers, the gift shop and other donations.

Their members work on the restoration of a variety of airplanes. The day we visited we saw a couple of them working on a DC-3. They had sheets of aluminum and were cutting some sections with tin snips to repair a missing panel. These fellows weren't a lot different than the guys you see at the Smithsonian except, maybe, they were a much smaller group and had fewer resources to draw on. They didn't look a lot different than our members except they are restoring and exhibiting while we are building and crashing. Some of them had, earlier, been active in RC modeling. There was a real sense of comradery and pride in the planes they had restored.

They have on display a variety of aircraft including a rare Douglas "Skystreak", a T-33 jet trainer, an F-84 Thunderjet and a great number of unusual and one of a kind planes.

Additionally, they have a large number of engines which they have restored and other aircraft memorabilia. CHAC has a website at www.chacweb.com.
