The Smithsonian Institution's National Air and Space Museum opened a new facility to house its huge collection of aviation and space crafts. The new facility will be named the Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center after its biggest contributor. It is located near the Dulles International Airport and will be comprised of a number of hangars to show off their tremendous collection. They have an observation tower where you can see jets and other aircraft take off and land from Dulles. Also, they have a theater and you can visit gift shops and

restaurants.

Many spacecraft and aircraft are on display. Some of the more notable are the shuttle "Enterprise", a retired Concorde supersonic jetliner, an F-4 Phantom fighter and the B-29 Superfortress "Enola Gay". In addition there are a variety of experimental flying machines.

There is a restoration and preservation facility where the public can watch specialists at work.

The day was eventful in that we got to see President Bush arrive by helicopter. There were also fly-bys of Stealth bombers and the Air Force Thunderbirds. Neil Armstrong and Chuck Yeager spoke to the crowd. There were a lot of exhibits and old airplanes on display.
