CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'...

When my nephew Steven Silvestri invited Mary Ann and I to visit him, his family, new baby and new house in Encino, California, I saw this as a great opportunity to see what some of those California RC clubs were like. It was a beautiful day (it never rains in California) when Steven took us to the Apollo 11 Model Airport. What I found was a huge complex which would be the envy of any RC flying modeler. The complex is owned and administered by the City of Los Angeles and Parks Department. All maintenance, grass cutting, rolling, and trash pick up for the site is provided. One needs only to show up with membership in the Academy of Model Aeronautics (for insurance purposes) to participate. Everything else is pretty informal. There are some general regulations posted governing the operation and safety of the site. After that you are pretty much on your own.

The complex provides for all types of flying: there are discreet areas for electric flyers, helicopters, control line and gas/glow airplanes. The gas/glow airplane site is the most impressive. It is comprised of a 900 ft hardtop runway with three taxiing lanes to proceed from the pit area to the runway. The pit area is quite large and in a nicely shaded area. There are no hold downs to start the planes and there is no restraining fence adjacent to the runway. A great safety factor is that the pit area is several hundred feet from the runway. Taxiing is done to the runway after the

plane is started in the pit area. There are many flying spots on the runway but only the pilot and his spotter are allowed at each.

While the flying site is open to all, several RC clubs use it as their designated flying site. I met Jack Pfeifer, a member of the San Fernando Valley Giant Scale Squadron, who explained a lot of this to me. Jack is an avid giant scale modeler. This day he had his beautifully done P-51 Mustang. It has an 83 inch wingspan, retracts and is powered with a Moki 1.8 engine. It was finished with "flite metal" a covering which consists of aluminum with an adhesive backing. It was outstanding work. Jack was flying with his friend Corey Dale.

The visit to the Apollo 11 Field was very enjoyable. It provided an interesting insight as to how publicly owned and operated RC flying sites can function. This could be a significant factor as land for RC sites becomes more scarce.

FROM THE PITS...

Herman Reichart was flying his King Kombat, a flying wing that he scratch-built from left over scraps using plans from RC Modeler. It is controlled by "elevons" which is a combination of ailerons and elevator. The plane is powered with an OS 25. It's incredibly fast and it's a credit to Herman's flying skills that he can stay in front of it.

Dan Bowman was flying his Cap 232. It spans 80 inches and is powered with a Fox 3.2...lots of vertical, just the way Dan likes them.

Achille Silvestri brought out his new Goldberg "Protege". It is a high wing trainer spanning 71 inches and powered with an OS 61 2c engine. Achille modified some general

features of the plane to soften its lines and give it its own character. While the plane is classified as a trainer, the trims can be adjusted to provide some elementary type of stunt flying. Flying the Protege is very easy and comfortable.

THE WORK PARTY...

We had a good turnout at the work party. Rain threatened, but we persisted and moved a lot of dirt to fill in lots of holes and protect the new drainage pipe. Hopefully, the modifications will hold up for a while and give us a better road for the next season.
