Earl Mc Mullen brought in a Taylorcraft which he built under contract for a person to hang in his own private airplane museum. It has no motor or internal workings. The sponsor wanted it to reproduce in scale a 1937 Taylorcraft that he owned many years ago. The plane is from a Lanier kit. It has a 108 inch wingspan. Earl did a wonderful job of reproducing many of the details including steps, handles, working doors and other scale features. He finished the plane in the authentic original paint scheme. There were a lot of guys there that wanted to stick a

Tom Moyer presented a good idea for recycling all those old computers that are piling up in your basement. He showed an all foam "Shockflyer" that he had just scratch built. He powered it with a CD Rom brushless motor that he scavenged from an old computer. He powered it up with a lithium-polycarbonate battery and equipped it with mini-servos. That plane is impressive, it looks like it could really do something.

Earl McMullen is in the middle of building a Lockheed Constellation Super G (L-049). This is a huge project. Earl designed and is scratch building the whole project. The L-049 will be powered by four Super Tigre 91 engines. It will have electric retracts and fully operating Fowler flaps. The final plane will be painted in a red and white color scheme like the TWA passenger line. Earl has nearly completed the wing, he plans to have the plane finished next year.

THE VANCOUVER WATER BOMBERS by Phil Carey ...

Recently, I had the opportunity to visit Vancouver BC in Canada. My employer had sent me there for some training. On the weekend some of the people I was traveling with, and I, visited a place on Vancouver Island called Sprout Lake. At Sprout Lake are kept two water bombers that were originally manufactured at Martin Marietta in Baltimore in the late 40s. The military used them as water based long range bombers. The military later sold these aircraft to a company in Canada that onverted them into water bombers to fight forest fires. Originally, there were four bombers...two of them met their demise fighting fires. The other two are kept at Sprout Lake and are still used to combat forest fires.

This is the off season for the water bombers. They are taken out of the water to be checked and reconditioned every year. This is where I got to see them. It was lucky for the group of us (some more excited than others) that a crew was reconditioning a very large heavy lift helicopter that was also used for fighting fires. One of the crew hung around, and after we explained where we were from, some 2400 miles away, allowed us to come inside for a closer look. This was a very enjoyable visit.
