Achille Silvestri brought in his original design and scratch built early theme vintage plane. The USA probably didn't have a reconnaissance plane in WWI, but if it did it might have looked something like this. That's why this plane is called the "Pseudo-Recon". It has an open cockpit, open frame



fuselage, and a parasol wing. It looks like something out of the deep past. It weighs in at 10 pounds and is powered with a Super Tigre 90. It has a 72 inch flat bottomed wing and should fly like a trainer...we'll see.

We've all seen the great increase in electric flyers. There are more and more of them at our field all the time. One of their biggest proponents is Joe Nixon. I saw Joe the other day flying an electric Mini-Ultrastick. It was really a nice plane, built-up, not one of those "foamy" jobs. And then I saw it fly and I was really impressed. It flew well and had a nice flight time on a single battery charge.

Talking with Joe it seemed to me that his system was a good compromise between those totally contained packages selling for about \$200 and those very exotic custom systems sometimes approaching \$1000.
