Tom Insley and the micro-Copter

Tom Insley brought in the smallest helicopter I have ever seen. It fit in the palm of his hand. It was complete with a transmitter, a receiver, a main rotor motor and a smaller motor for the tail rotor. It was very agile, has some versatility and is apparently indestructible. It looked like a big bug. Oddly, it would fly up towards the light, bump it and fall to the floor undamaged. All this for \$29 at your nearest Wal-Mart.

Achille Silvestri brought in his EAA Biplane. It's an authentic copy of a home-built airplane that was easily assembled in your garage with ordinary tools. Achille's plane was built from a Balsa USA kit. It's quarter scale and would qualify for giant scale fly-ins. It's not set up yet but it will have a Supertigre 90 when it's ready to go.

Leo Behr (we're going to have to call him "the professor") gave another very scholarly presentation. This time he described a process he developed for carving propellers. He said it goes back to his initiation with giant scale planes. He broke his first prop which cost him \$40. He tried it again...crack, another \$40. Leo said this was not going to work. Thereby, he set about finding a way of making his own propellers. He selected the proper woods and made his own templates and pitch gages. He described techniques for making rough carvings and the fine sanding all the way down to the final finished surface. Leo's propellers are truly works of art. They would easily make a very attractive wall hanging.

This was a good year for show and tell, hope it continues when we start up again next year.

SO WHO WAS CHARLIE HUGHES ANYWAY?...

Charles Hughes, who passed away April 15, was a member of Swan Harbor RC and Harford County Radio Control Modelers. Most of you new guys probably didn't know Charlie. He hadn't been well for several years and didn't fly a lot. But in the early days, when he was well, Charlie was a tremendous influence on RC modeling in Maryland. But RC was only a subset of Charlie's love of aviation. He always carried a much larger picture than just modeling. His interests ranged from his love of aviation history to the history of our RC modeling flying clubs. Although Charlie was a resident of Harford County, his many flying interests connected him to individuals and flying clubs all over Maryland. He was representative to the Maryland Modelers Association for many years and served as its president 1997-1998. They sought to provide coordination for all of Maryland aeromodelling RC activities. Charlie's association with the Westminster Aero Modelers led him and his associates to teach aviation history to every 3rd grade in Carroll County for 10 years.
