**Nord Lock Washers** by Bob Bartell

### **LOOSE BOLTS?**

I have a DLE35RA gas engine that just won't keep it's muffler on. No matter what I've tried, the bolts always loosen up. Someone at the field said, "I wonder if Nord-Lock makes small washers".


(Thanks Herman!) I had never heard of Nord-Lock washers so I investigated them and, yes, they do make them as small as metric M3. Nord-lock is a 2 piece locking washer.

# Ref: Copied the following from the marketing material

- Nord-lock washers are recognized for their ability to safely secure bolted joints exposed to <u>severe</u> <u>vibration</u> and dynamic loads.
- Nord-Lock secures bolted joints with tension instead of friction. The system is comprised of a pair of washers that has cams on one side and radial teeth on the opposite side.
- Since the cam angle 'a' is greater than the thread pitch 'β' a wedge effect is created by the cams, preventing the bolt from rotating loose."
- It's important to buy them according to the exact bolt size in order for them to work properly.







- Also, they must be installed against metal, not wood and without using a regular washer.
- Since installing them, I have not had a problem
