Kuenzel Inducted as Fellow Of College of Trial Lawyers

Steven P. Kuenzel Sr., Washington, was recently inducted as a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers, one of the premier legal associations in North America.

Kuenzel was one of only three Missouri attorneys inducted. Only 136 out of almost 30,000 Missouri attorneys are currently members.

The induction ceremony took place during the 2017 spring meeting of the College in Boca Raton, Fla.

Founded in 1950, the College is composed of the best of the trial bar from the United States and Canada.

Fellowship in the College is extended by invitation only and only after careful investigation, to those experienced trial lawyers of diverse backgrounds, who have mastered the art of advocacy and whose professional careers have been marked by the highest standards of ethical conduct, professionalism, civility and collegiality.

Lawyers must have a minimum of 15 years' trial experience and extensive jury trial experience before they can be considered for Fellowship.

The College maintains and seeks to improve the standards of trial practice, professionalism, ethics and the administration of justice through education and public statements on important legal issues relating to its mission.

Kuenzel is the managing partner of the law firm of Eckelkamp Kuenzel LLP, located in Washington. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Missouri-Columbia in 1974 and his Juris Doctorate degree from the same institution in 1976.

He is admitted to practice in the Missouri state courts, U.S. District Courts for the Eastern and Western Districts of Missouri, and the U.S. Supreme Court.
