While serving as the human resources services administrator and certificated staffing administrator for San Diego Unified School District (SDUSD), Sharon Whitehurst-Payne, PhD, created a teacher internship program that increased the diversity of teachers in San Diego classrooms by recruiting minority and male teachers. The initial cohort consisted of primarily African American and male teachers, and it grew to increase the recruitment teachers of Asian, Pacific Islander and Filipino and Latino teachers in its subsequent years. Many of the interns continued to develop into stars in the district, serving as teachers, principals and district administrators. The program enabled the district to grow its pool of diverse teachers rather than recruit from outside the district, and the program still serves as a relevant model today.

Dr. Whitehurst-Payne earned her bachelor's degree in mathematics and history as well as her masters of teaching mathematics at Duke University. She earned her Doctorate in Educational Administration from the University of California, Los Angeles. Dr. Whitehurst-Payne served as a math teacher in SDUSD at Roosevelt, O'Farrell and Mission Bay High Schools and has taught as an adjunct faculty member at San Diego Community Colleges, California State University, San Marcos (CSUSM), and San Diego State University. Additionally, Dr. Whitehurst has been called to assist several school districts as a human resources consultant, including the San Ysidro, Coronado Unified and Oceanside Unified school districts, as well as Southwestern Community College. She completed a six year term as an Accreditation Commissioner for the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Dr. Whitehurst-Payne chairs both the San Diego City Schools Education Fund and the CSUSM University Auxiliary and Research Services Corporation (UARSC), and works with the Southeast San Diego Rotary Club on the special school projects in Southeast San Diego.
