Dear CHPCC Members!

We had a great pediatric turn out at the CCCC annual summit. It was so nice to be together as a community and we missed all of you who couldn't attend this year. While we are a separate entity from CCCC, the Annual Summit provides a great forum for our pediatric community to be together, build relationships, and share ideas with each other and our adult-focused colleagues. Many assembly topics were just as relevant to pediatrics as they are to adult HPM care, including the keynote speech by the open plenary.

The assembly kicked off with an amazing talk on health equity given by Dr. Kim Curseen. Dr. Curseen spoke with passion about how we can all work together to better serve historically marginalized communities. The summit included a full pediatric track with pediatric focused sessions available during each breakout session. The first day of the pediatric track focused on the current state of pediatric palliative care across the state during two of the breakout sessions. We heard updates on exciting programs developments at UCSF and Stanford. We reviewed the policy victories that have supported the growth of pediatric palliative care in California over the last 20 years and the challenges and victories as we have implemented these policies. We shared our challenges including staffing challenges and the opportunity increasing collaboration between tertiary care centers and agencies providing community-based care.

On the second day of the summit, we learned about the use of Dignity Therapy in Pediatrics and considered approaches to parental requests for nondisclosure. We hope to see even more of you at next year's Summit (to be held in the Southern California area) and to continue to have a strong pediatric presence among the presentations and workshops.


