Necessary Ingredients



Subject (noun or pronoun)
- Usually comes before the verb and tells who or what the sentence is about

Katie eats.



Verb

- Usually comes after the subject and tells the action, being, or state

Katie eats.

Optional Ingredients (for added flavor)



Object (noun or pronoun)

- Receives the verb and usually comes after a verb or a preposition

Katie eats fries.



Adjective or Adverb

- Adjectives describe nouns and pronouns and adverbs describe verbs

Katie eats quickly.



Prepositional Phrase

- Small words that tell when or where something is and are followed by an object

Katie eats in the kitchen

What role do the words have in these sentences?

He drinks soda at the table. Eddy is thirsty.

The table is big.

Eddy and his friends are happy in this cafe.
