

# Waste Carrier Licences and the Waste Transfer Process

## COURSE INFORMATION:

Individuals and businesses who transport waste with a view to profit must hold a waste carriers licence and must ensure that they comply with their duty of care by transferring waste to authorised persons/sites. Failure to hold a valid waste carriers licence or comply with duty of care legislation is a criminal offence. This course will provide police officers and staff with a knowledge of what to look for and what the legal process is.



## AUDIENCE

This course has been designed especially for police officers and police staff. This course is suitable for officers working in rural crime, community policing and immediate response, as well as officers involved in managing or assisting these teams, including intelligence officers.
