# TRIAL PREPARATION

### **COURSE INFORMATION**

No case is the same and each one will provide different challenges. What remains a constant, is that preparation is key to gaining credibility and confidence as a trial advocate. That preparation differs vastly for a Prosecution advocate who will rely heavily on their own assessment of the case and effective case management hearings at Court. However, experience demonstrates the unexpected twists and turns that a case may take in the lead up to and during trial.

Aswell as knowing the case inside and out, this course will focus on the practical tips and pitfalls to ensuring delegates can be confident in preparation but also adaptable to a change of circumstance.

It covers essential stages of trial preparation, from case review to courtroom presentation. The course will cover court etiquette, examination and cross examination techniques, structuring opening and closing speeches, speaking to witnesses at court and legal applications including applications to stay proceedings.

Using a combination of practical exercises, this course builds confidence, sharpens decision-making, and promotes resilient preparation under pressure.
