AN OVERVIEW OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE AND INVESTIGATIONS ACT 1996



Those involved in criminal investigations may at some stage be required to undertake the role of disclosure officer. It is therefore necessary that individuals are equipped with the essential skills to review and manage unused material, whether it is non-sensitive, sensitive or highly sensitive. Too often failings in disclosure result in cases collapsing, miscarriages of justice or criticism from the courts. Even if an individual is not assigned the role of disclosure officer, it is important for them to understand the disclosure obligations.


