COURSE INFORMATION

Those working in public authorities should have an understanding of the Regulation of Investigatory Powers (RIPA) Act 2000.

Where powers available are used incorrectly by public authorities they risk action being taken against them by the Investigatory Powers Tribunal which can award compensation, stop activity, quash authorisations, and order material to be destroyed.

AUDIENCE

This course has been designed for those individuals who are involved in the writing and application of authorisations under Part 2 RIPA 2000 or supervise those who write or make applications.

COURSE LENGTH AND DELIVERY METHODS

The course is a one-day course. It can be delivered virtually or in-person.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, participants will be able to:

- Describe Directed Surveillance and its key elements.
- Discuss the content of an application for Authorisation of Directed Surveillance Activity (DSA).
- Describe the purpose of Authorisation Review, Cancellation and record keeping.
- Describe how DSA applies in the digital and online environment.
- Demonstrate the correct application style required for a DSA application.
- Describe the judicial approval authorisation process.
