At first glance, Jesus' reply to the disciple who wants to postpone following Jesus seems quite callous. But let's be honest. Death is not a subject we are very comfortable discussing. Especially our own. Oh, we certainly know we have been saved by the grace of God through the cross of Jesus Christ. We know that our Lord and Savior has gone to prepare a place for us and will one day bring us to be where He is. We know our loved ones who have died have also been taken home. But we don't really want to think about the details.

Yet as a pastor, those very details are what I am often called to prepare. After having several parishioners contact me about making their funeral plans, I think it is time we all do the same. I know how easy it is to keep putting it off, thinking there will always be time. But we all know that death is no respecter of persons. And I can assure you, that it is much easier on the family when you have already made your wishes known.

Taking the time to sit down and contemplate your final arrangements can be a personally satisfying spiritual practice. What are your favorite hymns, the ones that have spoken to you in your life? What is your confirmation verse, what Scripture has guided you through the rough periods of your life? What would you like to have mentioned in your funeral homily? All of these questions and many more are covered in our Funeral Planning Worksheets. So, perhaps Jesus had a point when He suggested that those final burial details should not have to fall to our loved ones in their time of grief. Call me to make an appointment to plan your own final arrangements (no matter your age.)

May it be well with you and may you live long on the earth. (Ephesians 6:3) Amen.


