Transition Team Update

The Transition Team has continued its work. From the congregational meetings held in October, it was evident that another meeting was needed to allow members more time to express their views and for the Transition Team to get more details on information for the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). This workshop meeting was held on Sunday, November 7th. The Transition Team served breakfast which was followed by a brief worship service. The workshop meeting then began. Members were asked to identify and discuss the challenges and opportunities to the following topics: Loss of Identify, Blending with Another Congregation, Having One Service, Supporting the Homeless, Leadership in our Church, Supporting Youth and Family, and Sustainability. There was excellent discussion and leadership from the congregation during the workshop. As a congregation, in summary, we want to maintain our strong Lutheran heritage, we are open to sharing a pastor, the council took it under consideration to consider a trial period of one service, we strongly wish to support youth and family, each other, and the homeless, we would like a strong leader in our future pastor and are willing to do the work he/she would put before us, and we realize we can only afford a part time pastor. In order of importance to our congregation, The Top 5 Gifts for Ministry our congregation identified for our future pastor were: 1. Bring joy and good humor to relationships, 2. Help people develop their spiritual life, 3. Be effective in working with youth, 4. Be an effective communicator, and 5. Be able to share leadership and work in a team. The Top 5 Ministry Task identified were: 1. Preaching/Worship, 2. Pastoral Care and Visitation, 3. Youth and Family Ministry, 4. Building a Sense of Community, and 5. Ministry in Daily Life. The Transition Team is continuing to work on the MSP and will have it submitted to the Council by December 1st. This will complete the formal work of the Transition Team. We appreciate the congregation's participation in this new process. Thank you for the opportunity to serve in this capacity.
