The special offering for our midweek Lenten services has been designated for Homestead. The Homestead is a safe, residential transitional care program in Manhattan, KS, for women 18 years & older who are survivors of the sex trafficking industry and have been through a measure of their healing and recovery. Homesteaders enroll in school or participate in a job apprenticeship, continue with support and recovery work, and begin to move from being under a 100% supervisory program to 100% independence, integrating back into mainstream society in a productive and life-giving way.

### **Evangelism: What NOT to Do**

When traditional outreach misses the audience and "evangelism" becomes a dirty word, how can we share the Good News? Christians have hindered the work of evangelism in the following ways:

- Being judgmental
- Saying one thing and doing another
- \* Excluding people who are different from them
- Refusing to listen to new ideas or understandings about the Bible
- \* Criticizing people who express doubts or questions about faith

Even in our jaded culture, people are still receptive to the Gospel—if they are given the right introduction. If we reflect on the list above and eliminate these barriers, who knows what God may do?
