Notes from Nancy



"I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility, and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace."

Ephesians 4

As we continue to move through this transition time we continue to discern what God is calling us to do – to be. We know that God is already at work in the world and if we listen, we will hear God continually inviting us to join in the mission at hand. We don't have to invent something new, we need to listen and look at what is already happening.

"Jesus saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, 'Follow me". (Matt 9:9)

Our God is a promise-making and promise-keeping God. He has committed himself to us and rescued us. Now we are summoned to live in the light of that rescue.

The kept promises of God shape the life of each believer into a promise to keep. Because he has come, I must go. Because God has been found, I must seek. Because God loves, I too must love.

Whether you are eight or eighty, the call is still, "Follow me." Jesus calls us to a challenge continually new. To follow him is to participate, not just observe; to get involved in new experiences and responsibilities.

We all think of ourselves, it is a natural as breathing, and it is not necessarily bad. But I need to think things through in terms of God's gift to me. I need to remember that I am not called by Christ to compete. I am not expected to take another's place but to find my own.

When Jesus says, "Follow me", he offers me the freedom of the integrated life; he gives me himself in a loving fellowship which involves me in worthy causes and offers channels for all my energies.

For most of us, God's command doesn't take us away from what we are presently doing. It fills our lives with new significance by reordering our priorities and requiring us to submit our activities and plans to the test of Christian concern and love.

Tomorrow will be another of God's days. People will rouse themselves to get back into the harness. Today, and tomorrow too, there is Jesus. He inhabits the next moment, filling it with explosive potential. He calls me and he calls you, not to desert our work, but to transcend it by making it his. Tomorrow, as today, if we listen we will hear him say. "Follow me." -Gerhard E. Frost – "Journey of the Heart"

Corlene Lange saw an invitation to participate in the ELCA Vital Congregations RE-BOOT Camp and decided that Immanuel needed someone to attend this so she signed up. The first Zoom meeting was Thursday, January 14, 2022. Corlene didn't know exactly what to expect in the 1 ½ hour session and what a surprise! Corlene states "I was so excited when the session ended that I wanted to call everyone at Immanuel and personally invite you to future sessions!"

The material speaks directly to Immanuel on our transformational journey! Any kind of transformation begins with spiritual transformation. Therefore, we began our time together focusing on the Holy Spirit. Congregational transformation or renewal is often fueled by transformation and renewal in the leaders in the congregation. All of you are one of these leaders. Think of it this way, "Transformation begins with me." They encouraged us to focus on our spiritual growth during these next eight weeks and beyond. How might you develop or expand daily devotional practices? How might you take time in your daily schedule to notice the Spirit at work in the world? How is the Spirit inviting you to join in this work?

We learned from a panel of experienced practitioners about the transformation in their congregations. Their experiences and learnings applied to our congregation or ministry. While there might not be a direct correlation, listen for practices and principles underneath the stories that could be utilized for revitalization in our context.
