This month, as we celebrate Independence Day, we can relish the freedoms we take for granted, including freedom of speech, religion, and assembly. But we can also be mindful of Jesus' command that we love our neighbors as ourselves. Those three specific freedoms are what make it possible for us to worship whenever and wherever we choose free from the fear of reprisal or imprisonment. Those freedoms also allow all others to practice their beliefs whatever they may be. The freedom from fear is a blessing not everyone in the world enjoys. The right to practice the religion of their choice or to practice no religion at all is not a right everyone in the world can enjoy.

The Evangelical Lutheran Churches in Russia and the Ukraine are struggling during the ongoing conflict in the area. Many of our church personnel in Russia have fled to Germany. Those who remain live in constant fear of reprisal, imprisonment, even death. Although theoretically, our siblings are allowed to worship as Christians, they are not allowed to proselytize, to proclaim their faith to others, to spread the Good News we are all called to do as disciples of Christ.

The Christian churches in Palestine are also struggling to survive. We have four Evangelical Lutheran Churches in the West Bank. Although there are no Lutheran churches in the Gaza Strip itself, there are three Christian churches of other denominations there. For over a thousand years, Palestinian Christians, Muslims and even Jewish peoples have lived together and been free to worship God. All now worship in fear if they are able to worship at all.

So while we celebrate the birth of our country this month, let us be mindful of how greatly privileged we are to be able to worship free from fear and persecution. May we take the time to pray for all those around the world who do not have that luxury through no fault of their own. And may we realize what some people are willing to endure in order to worship our Lord and Savior, a right we too often take for granted.

"Dependence does not destroy human personality," writes Donald F. Baillie. Instead, people are "never so fully and so truly personal as when [they are] living in complete dependence upon God." Jesus modeled this type of living by depending completely on his heavenly Father.

In that light, let it be declared and hereby celebrated ...

- That all people everywhere depend on one another.
- That everyone needs everyone else for freedom, life, love and happiness.
- That all things in the natural order depend on everything else.
- That the Earth and all planets and stars are mutually dependent.
- That this universally shared dependence comes from God and is of God.

And that each individual part of this relationship has its own role in fulfilling God's plan.

The congregation needs to approve the Council's recommendation to accept the bid from Mid-Continental Restoration Company for exterior masonry repair, cleaning & water repellant application to the original church building, and patching/painting stucco window surround surfaces on the north side of the building. These projects total \$46,551. The Berkley Fund (designated for building repairs/maintenance) will cover these expenses but the Council would like to recover as much of the cost as possible through member donations.
