Food for thought ---

Someone once wrote a letter to the local newspaper that said, "Ministers seem to feel their sermons are very important, so they spend a great deal of time preparing them. I've been attending church regularly for over 30 years, and I've probably heard about 1,500 sermons. The awful truth is that I can't remember a single one! I wonder if a minister's time might be better spent on something else."

That Sunday, the Minister read the letter to her congregation and said she'd be interested in any replies the congregation might wish to send to her.

The following Sunday, the minister reported that she'd received many responses, most of them expressions of indignation aimed at the anonymous letter writer. She thanked the church members for the responses but said she was most thankful for one in particular, which she then read to the gathering.

"I have been married for 30 years. During that time, I have eaten well over 32,000 meals - mostly my wife's cooking - but I can't remember the menu of a single meal. Of course I can recall some of my favorite dishes, but not the menus. And yet, I received the nourishment from every single one of them. I have the distinct impression that without them, I would have starved to death long ago."

Summer is upon us with lots of warm sunshine filled days and beautiful evenings. We are encouraged to spend as much time as possible with family enjoying the outdoors.

Too often we use "family time" as an excuse to not come to worship. But as the above story reminds us, without spiritual nourishment our faith dies, and God is saddened that his children no longer have the time to give him thanks, hear his word or share his meal.

The church is the place where both our church family and our individual families can grow and learn to live in love. It is the place where all of God's children give thanks for the many blessings we have received.

God's work and the work of the church continues each day. I would encourage you to take the time to enjoy the summer, to marvel at God's creation and to spend family time worshipping with your brothers and sisters in Christ.

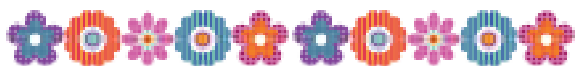
Transition Team Update

The Transition Team is currently conducting the Congregational Vitality Survey. The purpose of this anonymous survey is to gather information about our current ministries at Immanuel. We need your help to complete this next step in our transition process and it is very important that we collect as many surveys as possible to gain a perspective from a majority of the congregation.

Every confirmed member of the church received the survey with a self-addressed, stamped, return envelope. Please complete the survey by completely filling in the bubble with your response in pen or pencil. Completed surveys need to be returned by **May 27th**. Once all of the surveys have been received, the team will mail the surveys to the Center for Community Research and Development at Baylor University. The surveys will be analyzed and then a report will be prepared for our congregation based on your responses. The Transition Team will review those results with our synod liaison and the information gathered will help us navigate the next steps in the transition process.

This will not be the only time the Transition Team reaches out to you for information but it is very important that we hear from you as a congregation member. We want to hear your thoughts, ideas, and concerns as we continue to discern the next steps for our congregation. Also, continue to pray for our Transition Team as we continue to serve this congregation and listen to God's direction leading us forward in ministry.

The Synod Assembly is the highest legislative authority of the synod and is charged with electing members to the Synod Council, other synod committees and churchwide voting members, voting on a budget, and on other resolutions that are presented to the assembly. In addition to conducting the business of the synod, voting members and visitors gather for worship, presentations, and workshops designed to support the ministry we do together as a synod.

The 2021 Synod Assembly will be June 4-5 and will be held virtually by Zoom.

Immanuel members have been invited to help supply the Blessing Box at St John's Lutheran Church. The Blessing Box is a free food pantry that allows users to get help anonymously. Persons can take what they need and also donate items, "Take what you need and also donate items, "Give what you can." There are several Blessing Boxes located throughout Salina but the box at St. John's is the only one in the downtown area.



Please keep in mind the blessing box is outside and so items should be able to withstand extreme weather. Items in glass jars will not be accepted.

Items needed are:

- Pasta, rice, cereal, oatmeal
- Canned goods (fruit, veggies, jelly, meat, coffee)
- Bread, buns, bagels, English muffins, etc.
- Mac and Cheese (boxed or microwave containers)
- Boxed dinners (Hamburger Helper, etc.)
- Personal hygiene products (band aids, toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, toilet paper)
- Peanut butter (no glass jars)
- Cookies, Crackers, Chips, Tea, juice
