From a financial standpoint, we finished the year 2018 with a positive balance in our unassigned cash account. We are also pleased to report that the month of January 2019, resulted in positive financial results also. January is one of the months where we pay our quarterly insurance payment of \$4,000. Many times we are strapped for cash in that month. This year our unassigned cash exceeded our unassigned expenses by \$8,740.

## Dr. Dorothy Hanna Fundraiser Sunday, March 3 Noon - 1:30pm


Immanuel will be hosting a free will offering
